The Shooters Touch Academy Part II: An Intervention to Address Early School Departure

Presented to Jackson County COMBAT By Clyde Haravey July 21, 2014

Clyde Harvey, a local youth development specialist with a background in coaching youth, has developed a multi-faceted academy for grades 3 – 8. The academy attracts youth through physical coaching (basketball), while providing life-skills and academic support, for 3 hours per evening, 5 nights a week, summers and during the school year.

The program was perfected at Penn Valley Community College in Kansas City. Now, it is operating in Independence and at this time COMBAT is being asked to support the further expansion into Southern parts of Jackson County (specifically the Hickman Mills area) so that these underserved youth to get desperately needed services. In addition, the youth development part of the program will be enhanced by monitoring and evaluation of the tutoring, life skills/self-discipline and healthy lifestyles from the Nutritionist.

The Shooters Academy will serve 40 youth at each site. The Life Skills curriculum includes Healthy Living (Obesity Prevention), Violence Prevention, and Self-Discipline. These courses are led by trained professionals. In addition, for an hour each day of the program academic assistance is provided, including Homework Checks from schools.

PROPOSED PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The temptation to leave school before graduation is overwhelming. However the department doesn't begin on the day the students refuses to attend school....it starts well before that. Studies have shown that the decision to depart from school begins months before. Thus, counteracting this approaching event is what the Shooters Tough program is all about. The program introduces basketball to group of 40 year as a "hook", serving the eastern, western and southern parts of Jackson County. The program starts with a modicum of fun—but eventually graduates into discipline, homework assistance and violence and drug prevention. We are also exploring partnering with the MyArts program to including this type of exposure.

We employ every method imaginable to maintain the youth's interest, knowing that the bonding period may take a while. Life skills are introduced and enhanced at the beginning of the program, to get and keep a "head start" as school opens in the fall of 2014. It is our plan to meet with each individual teacher and make them fully aware of each student's experience in this program. That line of communication will remain open throughout the school year. Too many similar programs only intervene after something negative has occurred, thereby placing

undue time and effort on the problem, rather than the total student. This program aims to interrupt this unrewarding cycle.

PROPOSED ACTIVITY

TARGETED GROUPS

The program targets third up to eighth grade boys and girls for the program. High schools students can be accommodated in a separate group if enough participate. It is important for younger children to witness the attitude and approach of the older youth. Also older youth are excellent skill enhancers for their younger, less agile counterparts. Educators and community leaders have already been contacted and have pledged to refer to and support the program. No problem is foreseen in attracting the forty "lucky" youth.

LOCATION

As of now, we are talking with administrative officials at Penn Valley Community College, Raytown Middle School and Sporting Lodge, KC Police Department Recreation Center at South Patrol, and other various gyms in the metropolitan area. Their facilities would accommodate the need for classrooms as well as athletic accommodations. Inherently, the college campus would send a subtle but strong message about the importance of education.

Teens in Transition: a new summer youth program from KC NoVA (the Kansas City No Violence Alliance)

In a new program this summer, KC NoVA (the Kansas City No Violence Alliance) focused on 27 youth who have been identified as gang affiliated. Many of them had committed violent crimes or faced gun charges. The program was initiated this spring after Kansas City police asked if KC NoVA might be able to do something to help decrease youth violence in the city this summer.

Using KC NoVA intelligence data, client advocates identified youth affiliated with various gangs, ages ranging between 12 and 18. The youth were asked to spend eight weeks in a four-day-per-week program that would engage them in a variety of ways, including case management, tutoring, life skills, job training and art. This group met during "high-risk hours" (3:00-6:00pm) at the Arts Tech building at 1522 Holmes. The program began on June 3rd and will end on August 2nd (it was extended to a ninth week) with a special community beautification event at Linwood and Indiana.

The program is built around life skills taught by Michael Toombs and staff.

Throughout the program, the young people work on anger management, time management, coping skills, education through tutoring, team building, and finally community involvement. There is also intensive case management conducted by the KC NoVA Client Advocates where the youth are provided help with education, job training, housing, mediation, and any other assistance they or their family may need. Through the life skill sessions the youth will have created two permanent installations to be placed in

their communities as a reflection of how they see their community as one. One installation will be at Linwood and Indiana on a lot owned by Kansas City Public Schools and the second will be installed at Wards Chapel Church near 21st and Prospect. On Aug. 2, the youth will showcase their work from this summer at a special community event that will also feature barbeque and music. KC NoVA and Kansas City Public School board members have been invited to attend the event, as well as the youth and their families.

KC NoVA is a collaboration involving key law enforcement and community leaders, dedicated to reducing violence in the city's core. The governing board members of KC NoVA: Police Chief Darryl Forte, Mayor Sly James, U.S. Attorney Tammy Dickinson, Jackson County Prosecutor Jean Peters Baker, ATF Special Agent in Charge Greg Gant, FBI SAC Mike Kaste, UMKC Chancellor Leo Morton and Jackie Dunn, regional administrator of Missouri Probation and Parole.


