SPECIAL CONDITIONS

6. The grantee agrees to assist BJA in complying with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the National Historic Preservation Act, and other related federal environmental impact analyses requirements in the use of these grant funds, either directly by the grantee or by a subgrantee. Accordingly, the grantee agrees to first determine if any of the following activities will be funded by the grant, prior to obligating funds for any of these purposes. If it is determined that any of the following activities will be funded by the grant, the grantee agrees to contact BJA.

The grantee understands that this special condition applies to its following new activities whether or not they are being specifically funded with these grant funds. That is, as long as the activity is being conducted by the grantee, a subgrantee, or any third party and the activity needs to be undertaken in order to use these grant funds, this special condition must first be met. The activities covered by this special condition are:

- a. New construction;
- b. Minor renovation or remodeling of a property located in an environmentally or historically sensitive area, including properties located within a 100-year flood plain, a wetland, or habitat for endangered species, or a property listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places;
- c. A renovation, lease, or any proposed use of a building or facility that will either (a) result in a change in its basic prior use or (b) significantly change its size;
- d. Implementation of a new program involving the use of chemicals other than chemicals that are (a) purchased as an incidental component of a funded activity and (b) traditionally used, for example, in office, household, recreational, or education environments; and
- e. Implementation of a program relating to clandestine methamphetamine laboratory operations, including the identification, seizure, or closure of clandestine methamphetamine laboratories.

The grantee understands and agrees that complying with NEPA may require the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement, as directed by BJA. The grantee further understands and agrees to the requirements for implementation of a Mitigation Plan, as detailed at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/BJA/resource/nepa.html, for programs relating to methamphetamine laboratory operations.

Application of This Special Condition to Grantee's Existing Programs or Activities: For any of the grantee's or its subgrantees' existing programs or activities that will be funded by these grant funds, the grantee, upon specific request from BJA, agrees to cooperate with BJA in any preparation by BJA of a national or program environmental assessment of that funded program or activity.

- 7. To avoid duplicating existing networks or IT systems in any initiatives funded by BJA for law enforcement information sharing systems which involve interstate connectivity between jurisdiction, such systems shall employ, to the extent possible, existing networks as the communication backbone to achieve interstate connectivity, unless the grantee can demonstrate to the satisfaction of BJA that this requirement would not be cost effective or would impair the functionality of an existing or proposed IT system.
- 8. To support public safety and justice information sharing, OJP requires the grantee to use the National Information Exchange Model (NIEM) specifications and guidelines for this particular grant. Grantee shall publish and make available without restriction all schemas generated as a result of this grant to the component registry as specified in the guidelines. - 9. The recipient is required to establish a trust fund account. (The trust fund may or may not be an interest-bearing account.) The fund, including any interest, may not be used to pay debts or expenses incurred by other activities beyond the scope of the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program (JAG). The recipient also agrees to obligate and expend the grant funds in the trust fund (including any interest earned) during the period of the grant. Grant funds (including any interest earned) not expended by the end of the grant period must be returned to the Bureau of Justice Assistance no later than 90 days after the end of the grant period, along with the final submission of the Financial Status Report (SF-269).

- 10. The grantee agrees to comply with all reporting, data collection and evaluation requirements, as prescribed by law and detailed by the BJA in program guidance for the Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program. Compliance with these requirements will be monitored by BJA.
- 11. The recipient agrees that any information technology system funded or supported by OJP funds will comply with 28 C.F.R. Part 23, Criminal Intelligence Systems Operating Policies, if OJP determines this regulation to be applicable. Should OJP determine 28 C.F.R. Part 23 to be applicable, OJP may, at its discretion, perform audits of the system, as per the regulation. Should any violation of 28 C.F.R. - 12. The recipient agrees to ensure that the State Information Technology Point of Contact receives written notification regarding any information technology project funded by this grant during the obligation and expenditure period. This is to facilitate communication among local and state governmental entities regarding various information technology projects being conducted with these grant funds. In addition, the recipient agrees to maintain an administrative file documenting the meeting of this requirement. - 13. The grantee agrees to comply with the applicable requirements of 28 C.F.R. Part 38, the Department of Justice regulation governing "Equal Treatment for Faith Based Organizations" (the "Equal Treatment Regulation"). The Equal Treatment Regulation provides in part that Department of Justice grant awards of direct funding may not be used to fund any inherently religious activities, such as worship, religious instruction, or proselytization. Recipients of direct grants may still engage in inherently religious activities, but such activities must be separate in time or place from the Department of Justice funded program, and participation in such activities by individuals receiving services from the grantee or a sub-grantee must be voluntary. The Equal Treatment Regulation also makes clear that organizations participating in programs directly funded by the Department of Justice are not permitted to discriminate in the provision of services on the basis of a beneficiary's religion. - 15. Grantee agrees to comply with the requirements of 28 C.F.R. Part 46 and all Office of Justice Programs policies and procedures regarding the protection of human research subjects, including obtainment of Institutional Review Board approval, if appropriate, and subject informed consent.
- 16. Grantee agrees to comply with all confidentiality requirements of 42 U.S.C. section 3789g and 28 C.F.R. Part 22 that are applicable to collection, use, and revelation of data or information. WHEREAS, the COUNTY of Jackson agrees to provide the CITY 3 \$22,031.00 from the JAG award for Salary Recovery; and

NOW THEREFORE, the COUNTY of Jackson, CITY1, CITY2, CITY3, CITY4, CITY5, and CITY6 agree as follows:

Section 1.

COUNTY OF JACKSON agrees to pay CITY 1 \$538,100.00 of JAG funds.

CITY 1 agrees to use \$538,100.00 for Neighborhood and Community Services, the Board Kansas City Police Department, AIM 4Peace, Kansas City Missouri Prosecutor's Office.

Section 2.

COUNTY OF JACKSON agrees to pay CITY 2 a total of \$10,519.00 of JAG funds.

CITY 2 agrees to use \$10,519.00 to Purchase Miscellaneous Technology Upgrade Equipment and to purchase Youth Awareness Trading Cards for the Community/Youth Drug Awareness Project.

Section 3.

COUNTY OF JACKSON agrees to pay CITY 3 a total of \$22,031.00 of JAG funds.

CITY 3 agrees to use \$22,031.00 for Salaries.

Section 4.

COUNTY OF JACKSON agrees to pay CITY 4 a total of \$101,293.00 of JAG funds.

CITY 4 agrees to use \$100,293.00 to purchase Law Enforcement Equipment.

Section 5.

COUNTY OF JACKSON agrees to pay CITY 5 a total of \$10,104.00 of JAG funds.

CITY 5 agrees to use \$10,104.00 to purchase Law Enforcement Related Equipment.

COUNTY OF JACKSON agrees to pay CITY6 a total of \$15,239.00 of JAG funds.

CITY6 agrees to use \$15,239.00 for Salaries and to purchase Law Enforcement Related Equipment.

Section 7.

COUNTY OF JACKSON agrees to receive a total of \$347,569.00 of JAG funds.

COUNTY OF JACKSON agrees to use \$347,569.00 for Salary Recovery.

Section 8.

In accordance with the JAG legislation, COUNTY of Jackson will establish a trust fund for the JAG funds. Interest accrued from the trust fund will be given solely to the COUNTY of Jackson at the end of each calendar year of the grant period and/or at the close of the grant period.

Section 9.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against all participating CITIES under this Memorandum of Understanding.

Section 10.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against any COUNTY.

Section 11.

Each party to this agreement shall be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by one or more of the other parties.

Section 12.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this agreement.
