5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said that Ali Roohanirad, Acting Director of Public Works, was handing out the 2005 Annual Report from the Jackson County Public Works Department. The report reflects Public Works' renewed commitment to "Safety First, Quality Always." She said if there are any questions, Ali will be glad to discuss them.

Katheryn Shields said that Jackson County has won another national award for the environment. The National Association of Counties Center for Sustainable Communities announced that Jackson County will be a recipient of their 2005-2006 Center for Sustainable Community Awards. The field of finalists was quite strong, covering a wide range of health, economic development, housing, and environmental initiatives. Jackson County's Stadiums Recycling Program and Chiefs Kids Recycling Challenge Program was chosen as one of 10 winners nationwide for the honor. Judges are still finalizing the 2nd part of the competition and we are competing with nine other counties for \$25,000.00 in cash prizes. She will keep the legislature informed on the outcome.

Katheryn said that the re-bid process for the Fort Osage Education Center is almost complete. The bids have been received and are being analyzed by J.E. Dunn and staff. The project was initially bid last fall and bids received were higher than anticipated. Subtle changes were made to the design to lower the construction cost and the bids have come in much better this time. They should be ready for presentation next Monday.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, asked if someone could bring in a model of the Fort Osage Education Center project so the legislature can see what it looks like with the changes. Katheryn said she does not know if there is a model but will make sure the legislature has a drawing and complete information.

Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, wanted to make a clarification about question #2 on the ballot language. It is his understanding that if question #1 fails, then question #2 fails no matter how many votes it receives. Katheryn Shields said that is correct. Question #2 can not pass unless question #1 passes.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, said what we need to watch for are things that will come out in the next few weeks that are not accurate. Katheryn said there is a campaign web site that people can go to and get any information they need. The web site is www.saveourstadiums.com. People can also call her office with any questions.

Henry C. Rizzo, said a better job needs to be done to educate the public on the facts. We have two issues on the ballot and it can be very confusing.
