WHEREAS, the Jackson County Drug Commission has recommended COMBAT sponsor the Kansas City Mayor's Night – Sly's Rock the Block event, to be held August 18, 2012, at a cost to the County not to exceed \$1,500.00; and,

WHEREAS, Club KC is part of the Kansas City Mayor's Nights' youth activity programs created with the input of Kansas City youth to help keep young people safe during the summer; and,

WHEREAS, this sponsorship will allow COMBAT to support community events as part of the Drug Commission's marketing strategy to identify and support innovative programs that reduce violent crime within our community; and,

WHEREAS, Club KC is in its seventh weekend for this year and is expected to surpass 5,000 participants; and,

WHEREAS, said sponsorship is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of

the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,



COMBAT does not "sponsor" organizations or events, or assist with fundraising efforts. "Sponsorship" requests should be viewed through the lens of Advertising opportunities that help market COMBAT and its Mission of eradicating substance abuse and violent crime.

Parameters for decisions to recommend advertising to Legislature in response to sponsorship requests:

1. Total for such advertising in any one year: No more than \$10,000
2. Amount limitation: no more than \$1,500 **Amount requested: \$1,500**
3. Does applicant organization already receive other funding from COMBAT? Type:

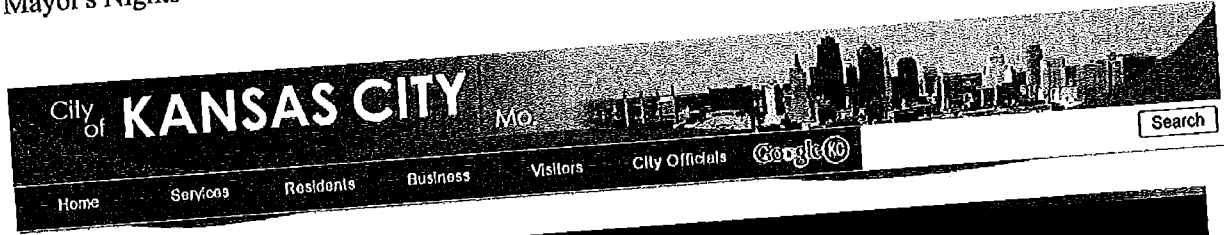

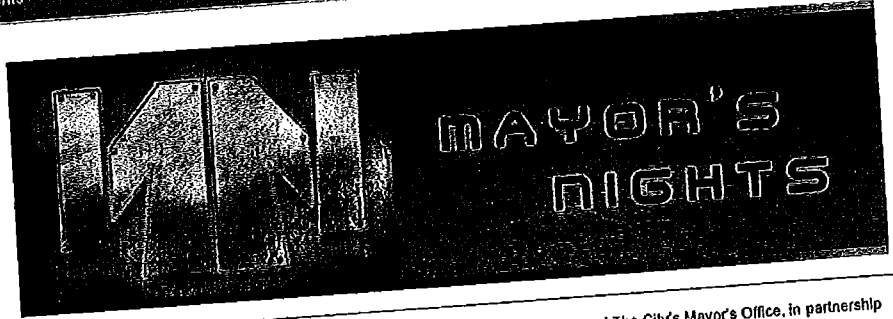

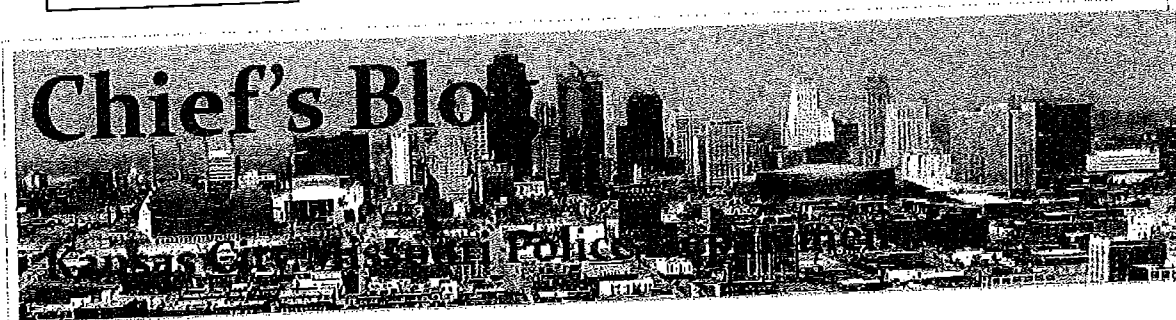

City's youth programming brings peace to the Plaza

Nights at the Country Club Plaza have been quiet so far this summer. But not far away, a youthful crowd is anything but quiet. They're having swim parties, playing video games, dancing to a professional DJ, learning moves from hip hop instructors, participating in 3-on-3 basketball and Xbox tournaments, watching movies, using computers and having snacks and drinks.

This past weekend alone (July 27-28), 1,050 high-schoolers went to the Brush Creek Community Center to participate in Club KC, a free summer weekend hangout for young people presented by the City of Kansas City. Another 420 middle-schoolers gathered at the Gregg Kilce and Tony Aguirre Community Centers last weekend. Those numbers have steadily increased since the City launched the program June 22.

This matters to police because this time last year and in 2010, we were devoting considerable resources to keeping the Plaza safe. Large crowds of young people gathered there, intimidating patrons, vandalizing property and occasionally erupting in violence. We have not had any major incidents on the Plaza this summer and no problems with rowdy crowds. This can be attributed to several things: curfews imposed last year and increased police presence. But I believe the opportunity the City is providing youth is the primary reason.
