## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said that health care and K.C. dental proposals have been received and there will be no increase in premiums for the employees. There was no increase from Humana and a slight increase from Kaiser. However, the slight increase of \$70,000.00 will be paid by Jackson County.
