3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Victor E. Callahan moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on . Seconded by Dan Tarwater.

4 HEARINGS

Bill Waris, legislative lobbyist, reported on the highlights of the 1996 Missouri General Assembly:

Jackson County received the additional two million dollars reimbursement for the stadiums.

Senate Bill 781 allows counties to receive up to \$37.50 a day from the State for reimbursement of inmates housed in the county jail. In 1997 we will receive \$20.00 a day which is an increase of \$3.00. This bill may also open the door for the county to receive more money for juvenile delinquents.

Senate Bill 869 allows an additional judge or drug court administrator to begin in 1998.

House Bill 1237 is an economic development bill which made it possible to raise the statutory limit on funding for the stadiums. He commended Senator Wiggins and Representative Rizzo for keeping the monies available.

Senate Bill 981 deals with the use tax, an issue which Jackson County has placed on the August 6. 1996 ballot.

W. T. Dawson, legislative lobbyist, announced that Senate Bill 560 passed which regulates towing. The County will have control of occupational licenses for towing companies which is currently done by municipalities. Jackson County will set the fee and it will be effective August 28, 1996.

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said the Legislature and Administration will need to address this issue and prepare an ordinance prior to the effective date in August.

Bill Waris said the benefit to Jackson County will be approximately 3-4 million dollars as a result of the efforts of the legislative and administative lobbyists in 1996.

Fred Arbanas said the weekly reports sent by the lobbyists were helpful to legislators and he appreciates the good work. He suggested that lobbyists begin working on a package to include Jackson County in the casino taxes.

Bill Waris said that a 25 cent casino tax would mean an additional 1 million dollars revenue for Jackson County.

Dan Tarwater thanked Bill Waris, W.T. Dawson, Alvin Nash, legislative lobbyists and Scott Marrs, administrative lobbyist. He commended them for working well as a team and with the Legislature. Victor Callahan agreed.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, reported that staff from the Administration as well as Dixie Flynn, County Legislator, attended a 5 day emergency management training seminar sponsored by FEMA, in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Jackson County received a grant from the federal government to participate and it proved to be a worthwhile exercise.

She reported that there was a good response to Lake Fest 96 this weekend held by the Jackson County Parks and Recreation Department at Lake Jacomo.

Victor Callahan presented a 15 year service pin to Katie Steward from the Assessment Department.
