5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, introduced Les Williams, her new appointment to the Jackson County Industrial Development Authority pursuant to County Executive Order #99-29.

She announced there will be a newsletter distributed with the payroll checks in an effort to have more internal communications. This is a suggestion that resulted from the outside the box meeting held last year. This will be published quarterly and if anyone has ideas they should contact Ken Evans, Public Information Officer.

She announced that Jackson County has a web site committee that has worked hard on developing a web site for each department. The web site should be up and running by the end of the week. Features available are job listings and applications, parks information, search for deeds on-line, e-mail to elected officials and county programs. Future options will include bids on county projects on-line, access to tax information, enter property taxes on-line and e-commerce which is payments made by credit cards for taxes or reservations for parks and recreation activities. This will make Jackson County more accessible to the public. She thanked the Legislature for their support and for providing the money needed to develop this project. Ken Evans distributed a handout on information available on the internet. Katheryn Shields welcomes any input or suggestions.

Katheryn Shields apologized for the lateness of the merit raises report. She explained that 42% of county employees received raises in February 1999 which consisted of individuals who were below the new minimums. The raise brought them up to the minimums based on the salary study. In 1999, for the first time, Jackson County began working on a paid for performance system. The remaining 58% of employees are being addressed through merit increases and raises have come from salary savings. A majority of the merit increases were done in July and less than half have been done for those employees with anniversary dates after August. All raises are based on each employee's performance evaluation. The report was distributed to the Legislature for their review. Discussion.

Finally, she gave an update on the Records Department. She referred to Resolution #12849 which deals with paid overtime for the Records Response Team. This did not include Department heads who worked overtime but were ineligible to receive it. This resolution is to reimburse the departments who paid their employees to work overtime in the Records Department. The second Resolution #12853 deals with staffing changes that the Administration recommends for the Records Department. She suggested that the Legislature and Administration meet to discuss several different options and the costs associated with them. During the meeting, Mary Helen Murphy, Director of Records, can give a full report on her recommendations. Katheryn Shields directed Mary Helen Murphy to contact Victor Callahan, Chairman of the Legislature, to set a date and time for the meeting.

Mary Helen Murphy reported that her department is currently recording deeds in 5 working days.

Ronald E. Finley said if the Legislature plans on calling a special meeting to discuss the Records Department expenditures and recommendations then he would also like to discuss audit procedures at that same meeting.

The Administration agreed with his request.
