## 4 HEARINGS

Bob WitbolsFeugen summarized his case against the Office of Human Relations and Citizen Complaints on behalf of the sunshine law. He asked the County Legislature to indemnify him for the legal expenses he incurred while seeking enforcement of the sunshine law. He asked them to authorize payment that a court would have ordered as a matter of course had the County Counselor's office acted honestly and honorably. He asked the Legislature to restore the process of regress for grievance.

There was much discussion on this issue.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, believes the Legislature should look at some type of regress for Mr. WitbolsFeugen.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked if the judgement had been satisfied.

Jane McQueeny, County Counselor, said her office is working on it and fines should be paid this week. She agreed to make a copy of OHRCC - Chapter 74 for all the legislators as it deals with the review of the decision that OHRCC reached.

Bob WitbolsFeugen said he sent a letter to members of the Legislature on June 24, 2002, requesting an appeal.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, asked Mr. WitbolsFeugen to provide the Legislature with a copy of the transcript regarding the County Counselor's representation of Chapter 16 to the court.

Jane McQueeny said she would provide the Legislature with a copy of the pleading in court so that they would have an understanding of the legal issues considered by the judge.

Ronald E. Finley asked the County Counselor to provide a copy of Chapter 16 - Defense and Indemnification - to all members of the Legislature.

Jay Haden, Deputy County Counselor, said that this is a proposal that the Legislature entertained during budget hearings.

Troy Thomas, Manager of Finance, said he would find out and report back to the Legislature next week.

Dennis Waits asked Mr. Thomas to get an estimate on what it would cost to eliminate the drive through teller lanes at the building located on Truman and Liberty.

Mr. Thomas agreed to get a figure and report back to the Legislature.

Ronald E. Finley asked about the assessment issue in the Kansas City School District.

Troy Thomas said Kansas City School District officials were satisfied with the reports as given.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, asked Mr. Thomas about the declarations as filed for Missouri Gas Energy which is 4 million less and A T & T Company which is 2.3 million less than last year's figure.

Troy Thomas said that field audits will be done on companies that have substantial drops in their assessed values. He agreed to report on the above named companies at next week's legislative meeting.
