SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

The Emergency Operation Center (EOC) grant program is intended to improve emergency management and preparedness capabilities by supporting flexible, sustainable, secure, and interoperable Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs) with a focus on addressing identified deficiencies and needs. This program provides funding for construction or renovation of a state, local or tribal governments' principal EOC. Fully capable emergency operations facilities at the state and local levels are an essential element of a comprehensive national emergency management system and are necessary to ensure continuity of operations and continuity of government in major disasters caused by any hazard.

Total award includes \$500,000.00 of federal funds and \$166,666.67 of local cost share funds.

## **ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT**

Once notification has been made, any subsequent request for funds will indicate recipient acceptance of the changes to the award. Please contact your local OHS Grant Specialist.
- 5. Provisions
  - A. Provisions applicable to a recipient that is a private entity.
    - 1. You as the recipient, your employees, subrecipients under this award, and subrecipients' employees may not:
      - a. Engage in severe forms of trafficking in persons during the period of time that the award is in effect;
      - b. Procure a commercial sex act during the period of time that the award is in effect; or
      - c. Use forced labor in the performance of the award or subawards under the award.
    - 2. We as the State awarding agency may unilaterally terminate this award, without penalty, if you or a subrecipient that is a private entity:
      - a. Is determined to have violated a prohibition in paragraph A.1 of this award term; or
      - b. Has an employee who is determined by the agency official authorized to terminate the award to have violated a prohibition in paragraph A.1 of this award term through conduct that is either:
        - i. Associated with performance under this award; or
        - ii. Imputed to you or the subrecipient using the standards and due process for imputing the conduct of an individual to an organization that are provided in 2 CFR Part 180, "OMB Guidelines to Agencies on Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Non-procurement)," as implemented by our agency at 2 CFR Part 3000.
  - B. Provisions applicable to a subrecipient other than a private entity. We as the State awarding agency may unilaterally terminate this award, without penalty, if a subrecipient that is a private entity:
    - 1. Is determined to have violated an applicable prohibition in paragraph A.1 of this award term; or
    - 2. Has an employee who is determined by the agency official authorized to terminate the award to have

violated an applicable prohibition in paragraph A.1 of this award term through conduct that is either:

- a. Associated with performance under this award; or
- b. Imputed to the subrecipient using the standards and due process for imputing the conduct of an individual to an organization that are provided in 2 CFR part 180, "OMB Guidelines to Agencies on Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Non-procurement)," as implemented by our agency at 2 CFR part 3000.
- C. Provisions applicable to any subrecipient.
  - 1. You must inform us immediately of any information you receive from any source alleging a violation of a prohibition in paragraph A.1 of this award term.
  - 2. Our right to terminate unilaterally that is described in paragraph A.2 or B of this section:
    - a. Implements section 106(g) of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (TVPA), as amended (22 U.S.C. 7104(g)), and
    - b. Is in addition to all other remedies for noncompliance that are available to us under this award.
  - 3. You must include the requirements of paragraph A.1 of this award term in any subaward you make to a private entity.
- 7. Definitions. For purposes of this award term:
  - A. "Employee" means either:
    - 1. An individual employed by you or a subrecipient who is engaged in the performance of the project or program under this award; or
    - 2. Another person engaged in the performance of the project or program under this award and not compensated by you including, but not limited to, a volunteer or individual whose services are contributed by a third party as an in-kind contribution toward cost sharing or matching requirements.
  - B. "Forced labor" means labor obtained by any of the following methods: the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery.
  - C. "Private entity" means:
    - 1. Any entity other than a State, local government, Indian Tribe, or foreign public entity, as those terms are, defined in 2 CFR 175.25.
    - 2. Includes:
      - a. A nonprofit organization, including any nonprofit institution of higher education, hospital, or tribal organization other than one included in the definition of Indian Tribe at 2 CFR 175.25(b).
      - b. A for-profit organization.
  - D. "Severe forms of trafficking in persons", "commercial sex act", and "coercion" have the meanings given at section 103 of the TVPA, as amended (22 U.S.C. 7102).
- 8. Other Important Special Conditions
  - A. "Classified national security information," as defined in Executive Order (EO) 12958, as amended, means information that has been determined pursuant to EO 12958 or any predecessor order to require protection against unauthorized disclosure and is marked to indicate its classified status when in documentary form.
  - B. No funding under this award shall be used to support a contract, subaward, or other agreement for goods or services that will include access to classified national security information if the award recipient has not been approved for and has access to such information.
  - C. Where an award recipient has been approved for and has access to classified national security information, no funding under this award shall be used to support a contract, subaward, or other agreement for goods or services that will include access to classified national security information by the contractor, subawardee, or other entity without prior written approval from the DHS Office of Security, Industrial Security Program Branch (ISPB), or, an appropriate official within the Federal department or agency with whom the classified effort will be performed.

- D. Such contracts, subawards, or other agreements shall be processed and administered in accordance with the DHS "Standard Operating Procedures, Classified Contracting by States and Local Entities," dated July 7, 2008; EOs 12829, 12958, 12968, as amended; the National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual (NISPOM); and/or other applicable implementing directives or instructions. - E. Immediately upon determination by the award recipient that funding under this award will be used to support such a contract, subaward, or other agreement, and prior to execution of any actions to facilitate the acquisition of such a contract, subaward, or other agreement, the award recipient shall contact ISPB, or the applicable Federal department or agency, for approval and processing instructions.

## REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Each subrecipient is required to submit a Progress Report to OHS by June 10th and December 10th each year until all funds are expended or until the grant is closed. The Final Report is due 45 days after the contract end date.
