IN THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI

AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$1,000,000.00 from the undesignated fund balance of the 2020 CARES Act Fund to support a regional COVID-19 contact tracing and testing hub and authorizing the County Executive to execute a cooperative agreement with the Mid-America Regional Council and pay other costs necessary in connection with the fight against the ongoing Coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic.

ORDINANCE NO. 5377, July 20, 2020

INTRODUCED BY Theresa Cass Galvin, County Legislator

WHEREAS, U.S. President Donald J. Trump, Missouri Governor Mike Parson, and County Executive Frank White, Jr., have all declared, in one form or another, the ongoing Coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic to be a public health emergency; and,

WHEREAS, the County, through its various efforts, plays a significant role in the public health of its citizens and employees; and,

WHEREAS, an appropriate response by the County to this emergency will require significant expenditures from the County CARES Act Fund, which consists of monies provided by the U.S. Treasury for this purpose; and,

WHEREAS, with the funding provided by this ordinance, the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) will provide support to and supplement the current Jackson County Health Department testing, tracing, and investigation efforts to make sure all cases of COVID-19 are appropriately tracked to minimize any further spread of the virus as further outlined in MARC's attached funding proposal; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the following appropriation be and hereby is made:

Funding Proposal to Support the KC Regional Public Health Action Agenda for Regional Capacities for Testing and Tracing

Cooperatively Developed by Kansas City Metropolitan Area Public Health Departments

This agenda is built on the expectation that the bulk of testing and tracing operations will be developed, carried out and managed by local health departments, health care agencies and state governments. This agenda focuses on the regional capacities needed to support, expand and connect these efforts.

The budget assumes a 12-month timeframe beginning in late June/early July 2020. The funding request for the testing teams is focused at this time on meeting urgent needs to begin increasing testing over the next 12 weeks.

REQUEST SUMMARY	This ordinance appropriates \$1,000,000 in CARES Act funding to provide support for a regional contact tracing and testing program that will supplement current efforts of the Jackson County Health Department. Funding provided by Jackson County will: 1). help implement a regional coordination hub to collect and share data across the region; 2). Expand testing sites and surge capabilities particularly for vulnerable populations; 3.) develop a regional communications strategy to promote COVID-19 related behavior change; 4.) engage community organizations serving disadvantaged populations to encourage testing and provide needed social support; 5.) ensure adequate laboratory capacity to meet regional testing demands; 6.) establish a supply change network to meet regional testing demands; and 7.) support, connect and accelerate the work of local contact tracing teams. The \$1 million investment by Jackson County will be matched by a \$1 million investment by Johnson County, Kansas and at least \$2 million investment by area philanthropic organizations such as the Kauffman Foundation, the Health Forward and REACH foundations for a \$4 to \$5 million total investment in this initiative.

WHEREAS, the Parks + Rec Department is in the process of developing design and engineering plans to address three critical projects for facilities that will be permitted through the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MoDNR); and,

WHEREAS, the total project costs are estimated in an amount not to exceed \$750,000.00; and,

WHEREAS, one project will replace the wastewater treatment facility for the Lake Jacomo campground and boat dock with the construction of a new on-site, self-contained, no-discharge treatment facility meeting current MoDNR regulations; and,

WHEREAS, the second project will repair deteriorated portions of the concrete spillway at Prairie Lee Lake; and,

WHEREAS, the third project will repair deteriorated portions of the concrete spillway at Lake Jacomo; and,

WHEREAS, once design and engineering plans are prepared for each project, contracting for construction services shall be procured following the requirements of chapter 10 of the Jackson County Code, including competitive bidding and/or the use of approved term and supply vendors; and,

WHEREAS; a transfer is now necessary to place the funds required for the projects in the proper spending account; now therefore,

REQUEST SUMMARY	This resolution transfers \$750,000 in County Improvement Fund contingency funding to the Parks department to address critical infrastructure needs as the result of a recent inspection of Jackson County parks facilities by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. Three different projects are funded by this resolution, for a total not-to-exceed funding for all three projects of \$750,000. Project #1 is to replace the wastewater treatment facility for the Lake Jacomo campground and boat dock.
