5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, announced that the Truman Medical Center East Auxiliary is having their Pro-Am Golf tournament today at the Fred Arbanas - Longview Lake Golf Course. It is expected that 150 golfers and 40 area professionals will participate in this event. Former Kansas City Chief quarterback Len Dawson is the honorary chairman and their goal is to raise \$15,000 to \$20,000 to build the labor/delivery suite at TMC East.

Katheryn Shields gave an update on the Records Department. She said the county is now releasing through March 5, 1999, we still have 60 days to be within statutory guidelines. The statute states that documents be released within 60 days from the day it is filed. At this time, the County is releasing 70 days from filing.

Mary Helen Murphy, Director of Records, has devised a final push to complete this project. She has suggested a second shift (evenings from 5 p.m. to midnight) for the next 30 days. We have recruited employees from other county departments and law students from UMKC to staff the Kansas City and Independence offices. This is an estimate of 5,000 staff hours with machines manned from 8 a.m. to midnight.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, suggested the county try to begin releasing at least 15 days after filing.

Katheryn Shields said as soon as the Records Department is caught up their goal is to release within seven days.
