5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Bob Boley, Director of Assessment, said his department has identified the vehicles that were misbilled and are printing corrected bills. They do not know yet when the corrected tax bills will be mailed. The new bills will have a different due date printed on them. He said that additional staff will continue to answer phones and cashier until the tax season is over. Refunds will be made to those taxpayers who have already paid incorrect bills.

Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, asked if the due date for personal property taxes could be extended for all taxpayers in Jackson County, Missouri because of this problem.

Bob Boley responded that this is under consideration at this time.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, asked if staff from the Assessment Department at the Independence Annex could assist the taxpayers as they waited in line and perhaps get their phone numbers and call them back to help shorten the lines.

Bob Boley said this is being done.

Mr. Mike Douglas from Fahnestock and Company, Inc. and Mr. Sid Parsons with Gillmore Bell were present to talk about the Jackson County, Missouri, Public Building Corporation Leasehold Revenue Bonds which are being sold for the purpose of providing funds to finance and refinance costs related to public facilities for the County, namely the Public Works Maintenance Facility.

Jay Haden, Assistant County Counselor, said that Ordinance #3112 needed to be adopted today as they wanted to close this week.
