3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said an agenda item requires the immediate attention of the Legislature. It is a resolution in support of bringing the National Association of Counties Annual Conference to Kansas City, Missouri. This week-long conference is an incredible boon to the host county and city, attracting 4,200 people (each spending an estimated \$750 - \$1,000 over their stay) and at least 250 exhibitors as well.

Katheryn just returned from this year's NACo Conference in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. She was pleased that County Legislator, Scott Burnett, was able to attend. She said Jackson County has already begun working with the Greater Kansas City Convention and Visitors Bureau to put together an attractive bid. The Missouri Association of Counties has agreed to support our bid for NACo. She said her preliminary meetings with NACo officials in Milwaukee last week, made her optimistic about our chances.

The opportunity would be for either 2008 or 2009. Since 2008 is a presidential election year, this would be our target. Hosting the conference in that year would bring added benefits to our region, attracting national speakers, and national media attention to the conference. Although Jackson County would host - as with any major convention - this will take a community-wide commitment, and the entire metropolitan area will benefit. She asked for the Legislature's support of this preliminary step in the bid process.

Katheryn Shields said there will be legislation on next week's legislative agenda regarding a county storm water project. The total cost is \$20,000 with \$10,000 being contributed by the Corps of Engineers.

She reported two more milestones in Jackson County's E-Government initiative: Jackson County's food inspections are now on-line and images of all Jackson County plats are available on-line.

Food inspections are searchable by business name or by city. The food service division inspects all restaurants, grocery stores, schools, mobile food and temporary food establishments within the unincorporated area of Jackson County and the cities of Blue Springs, Buckner, Grain Valley, Grandview, Greenwood, Lee's Summit, Lone Jack, Oak Grove, Raytown and Sugar Creek.

Plats are now on-line back to 1835. Jackson County was only 10 years old at that time and Andrew Jackson was President of the United States. The Jackson County Records Department has recently completed the back indexing of all available plats and surveys. Currently, images of over 11,900 plats and 2,500 surveys are available through the Records Department web page, as well as at public terminals located in both offices. Additionally, surveys recorded since November 1975 are available as images on-line. Surveys recorded prior to November 1975 will be available later as the Records Department undertakes to place microfilmed documents into a digital format and place them into the database.

In Jackson County's efforts to improve E-Government services, this is one step of many to place all recorded instruments on-line for the convenience of the taxpayer and provide better service with the help of technology. This will improve land/title searches and reduce the time involved in the closing process for Jackson County taxpayers.

Katheryn Shields distributed the Energy Performance Update to legislators and said it will be discussed at next week's legislative meeting.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, complimented Katheryn Shields on a job well done while serving on the panels at NACo's annual meeting in Milwaukee.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked if Jackson County should be doing more with regards to it's mental health and energy performance initiatives.

Katheryn Shields responded that with regards to mental health, a Request for Proposal has been sent out for mental health needs assessment in Jackson County so that we can plan for the future.
