## 13 UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, commented on an article in the Kansas City Star where Legislator Dixie Flynn was quoted as saying she rarely sees any reports from the lobbyists and asked if she was still having a problem receiving her mail.

Dixie Flynn responded that she now has an aide and is having no trouble receiving mail. She said that she has only received one report from the lobbyists until today. She would prefer a report that would list the House Bills, summarize the bills, give the status and state whether the Legislature should support or oppose the legislation.

Dan Tarwater said he will make sure she receives future reports. He said it was not the call of the lobbyists to suggest the Legislature support or oppose the bills, that decision will be made by the Legislature as a Whole.

Fred Arbanas stated that he spoke with a member of the Board of Zoning Adjustment who said they have not had a meeting in a while and questioned whether the County should still have the Board of Zoning Adjustment.

Mac Andrew, Director of Public Works, responded that two members had resigned and that they will not have a quorum to hold a meeting until new appointments are made.

Jay Haden, Deputy County Counselor, said he went to a meeting last month and although some of the duties of the Board of Zoning Adjustment have been taken over by the Legislature, they still have work and provide a valuable function.

James D. Tindall, Chairman, said that Victor Callahan, Dan Tarwater, Katheryn Shields and himself went to Jefferson City to lobby on raising the cap for funding of the stadiums. He commended County Executive Katheryn Shields, State Representative Henry Rizzo and Jackson County Lobbyist Bill Waris for a job well done. He asked that everyone continue to lobby this important issue in Jackson County to get these bills out of committee. He also asked Katheryn Shields and Dan Tarwater to give all of the legislators a list of the members on the committee who will be listening to testimonies regarding this issue.
