Dan Tarwater, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Bob Spence moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 9/12/2005. Seconded by Henry C. Rizzo.

4 HEARINGS

Dan Tarwater, Chairman, presented a 20 year service pin to David Zachery, Operating Engineer in Facilities Management,

Public Hearing regarding the property tax rates of Jackson County, Missouri, Board of Services for the Developmentally Disabled, the Mental Health Fund and the Merchants' and Manufacturers' Inventory Replacement.

Dan Tarwater, Chairman, opened the hearing. No one was present to speak on the issue. The hearing was closed.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, asked for testimony from Manuel Perez and Mike Sanders regarding Request for Qualifications (RFQ) #27-05, which will access the impact of treatment programs of COMBAT.

Manuel Perez, COMBAT Commissioner, said his two recommendations were that all treatment programs be evaluated instead of just a select few and that a plan be devised to implement the findings.

Scott Burnett stated that a pre-bid conference was held today at 11 a.m. and the bids are due in October.

Robert A. Stringfield, County Legislator, asked if Mr. Perez read the RFQ and if he thinks COMBAT or the County Legislature should be involved.

Manuel Perez replied that he believes this should be a joint effort with COMBAT and the County Legislature.

Robert A. Stringfield asked if the COMBAT Commission was aware of the RFQ.

Manuel Perez said yes they discussed it at length at their last meeting. He also said he has been attending the meetings since this process started.

Dan Tarwater said that COMBAT will be the oversight committee. The county legislature is just starting the process.

Michael Sanders, Prosecuting Attorney, agreed with Mr. Perez. He thinks insuring independence of the evaluation, by allowing COMBAT to oversee the process, is a sound idea and principle.

Dan Tarwater said at the pre-bid conference today the bidders agreed that they could look at all treatment agencies funded by Jackson County not just a sampling.

Gary Dannaldson, Director of Purchasing, said he will issue an addendum to the RFQ to include all treatment agencies.

Henry C. Rizzo, County Legislator, said since an addendum is being prepared could it also include results of vendors. He asked who was over the day to day operations of this bid package.

Scott Burnett replied Vicki Boyd, Executive Director of the COMBAT Commission, and Jim Nunnelly, Anti-Drug Program Administrator, are working on it daily.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said there was a special session in Jefferson City, Missouri in which legislation was amended dealing with E-government records on-line. She thanked Representative Bryan Pratt and other members of the Jackson County delegation who assisted with the solution. She said Jackson County will dismiss the lawsuit since their efforts were successful.

With regards to the devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans on August 29th, she said she has been working with the Public Works Department to develop a plan for Jackson County to extend support in the clean-up and rebuilding efforts. Public Works is putting together a plan to send 6-8 employees, along with necessary equipment to New Orleans for two weeks to assist with current efforts. The cost of travel, employee time and equipment will be approximately \$100,000.00; part or all of which may be reimbursed by FEMA. She indicated that the Public Works Department would be drafting a Request for Legislative Action (RLA) to request funds for this relief effort and will present it to the County Legislature soon. She said any questions should be directed to Ali Roohanirad, Acting Director of the Public Works Department.

She reported some good news, which was that a bell stolen from Fort Osage in April 1993 has been recovered due to an anonymous call to the Sheriff's Department on Sunday morning. She thanked the Sheriff for his assistance in finding this missing piece of Missouri history. The plan is to incorporate the bell in the Missouri River Transportation Exhibit at the new Fort Osage Education Center.

Katheryn said she attended a Shadow Cliff Environmental retreat last week on the western slopes of the Colorado Rocky Mountains. Other attendees came from Johnson County, Kansas, the Environmental Protection Agency and private industry. She said they are planning another workshop for early June 2006 so the County Legislators and others could attend. She said there was good interaction and exchange of ideas.

She distributed employee of the month awards to the following: March 2005 Employee of the Month award went to Mosetter Reynolds, Records Representative in the Records Department; April 2005 Employee of the Month Award went to Bill Snyder, Acting Chief Deputy County Counselor; May 2005 Employee of the Month Award went to Debbie Bruckmeier, Human Resources Analyst; June 2005 Employee of the Month Award went to Cindy Pitts, Services Technician with the Parks and Recreation Department. She presented each of them with a pin, check and certificate.
