Dan Tarwater, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by County Legislator - 2nd District Tindall, seconded by Vice-Chairman Burnett, to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on for September 10, 2012. The motion carried by a voice vote.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Mike Sanders, County Executive, said the Missouri State Legislature failed to override the Governor's veto on out of state taxes (sales taxes collected on automobiles, planes, yachts, etc.). The impact on the budget of Jackson County, Missouri is roughly \$1.8 million per year. Other issues with budgetary impacts include the parcel reduction in the Assessment Department and issues in the Prosecutor's office regarding the Family Support Division. A general breakdown of the estimate of reductions is as follows: \$840,000 out of the General Fund, \$420,000 out of the COMBAT fund and \$630,000 out of the Sports Authority Fund.

Mike Sanders informed the County Legislature that requests for proposals for the animal shelter were sent out and are due on Friday, September 21. This is an informational tool and the Administration sent it out as instructed by the County Legislature. The Administration will analyze the information with the Legislative Auditor and present it to the County Legislature for further instruction. He emphasized that nothing has changed legally or otherwise.

Dan Tarwater said this project must be revenue neutral and Jackson County is not trying to get out of a contract as stated in the newspaper. Jackson County is trying to find who can do the best job.

Crystal Williams, County Legislator, pointed out that Jackson County still has an agreement with the City of Independence. This is a fact finding process.

Theresa Garza Ruiz, County Legislator, asked Stephen Nixon, County Counselor, what is Jackson County's legal stance if the County decides not to honor the contract with the City of Independence.

Stephen Nixon replied that this issue needs to be discussed in closed session.

The County Counselor agreed to post a closed session notice for Monday, September 24, 2012.

Mike Sharp, Sheriff, presented the July 2012 Employee of the Month Award to Adam Zarrillo, Deputy Sheriff.

Mike Sanders gave an estimate of the general sales tax revenue reductions: \$477,036 out of the General Fund, \$143,724 out of the Health Fund, \$100,464 out of the Parks Fund, \$118,776 out of the Road and Bridge Fund. The total aggregate is \$840,000, which is in addition to the reductions in the Assessment Department and Prosecuting Attorney's Office. He explained that this has been a source of revenue since Jackson County has been in existence. He advised that this needs to be foremost on our legislative agenda to close this loop hole.
