5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, announced that Jackson County has won a national award, the NACo Achievement Award, from the National Association of Counties (NACo), for cooperative agreement for sewer service. The agreement was between Jackson County and the City of Independence. She thanked Mayor Ron Stewart of Independence, Dick Champion, Director of Water Pollution Control from Independence, Jay Haden, Assistant County Counselor, Mac Andrew, former Director of Public Works in Jackson County, Mark Trosen, Ron Hilliard, Randy Diehl, Sylvia Inzerillo and Marilyn Snelling, staff from the Jackson County Public Works Department, for their work on this project. She also presented proclamations to the entities involved.

Katheryn Shields presented employee of the month awards to Sam Davis, Public Works Maintenance Supervisor, for the month of April and Randy Diehl, Public Works Codes Enforcement Officer, for the month of June.

She said that Jackson County will have a CORO intern this week working in the County Executive's office.

She announced that Jackson County has set aside one million dollars for the restoration of the Courthouse on the Square in Independence, Missouri. The State of Missouri has approved a dollar to dollar match for this project. To celebrate the approval of state funding, there will be a press conference on Thursday, June 29th at 1 p.m. at the historic courthouse on the Square.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, asked the County Executive about an article in the newspaper that said Jackson County had mailed letters to residents stating that the county would be suing to foreclose on their homes. He asked if this problem had been tracked and was it a city of Kansas City problem?

Katheryn Shields responded that the problem did occur in the city and that Jackson County will be working on developing a procedure to try and reconcile instead of sue the parties involved. She will advise the Legislature when this plan is complete.
