Dan Tarwater, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Bob Spence moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 8/1/2005. Seconded by Eugene Standifer Jr..

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said we are currently in Phase II of the improvements to the Kansas City Courthouse but the final phase is ready to begin. Recently completed items are the loading dock, the handicap accessible West entrance and all the sidewalks and landscaping on Oak Street. Soon to be completed will be the North entrance on August 17, 2005. The work includes: new North entrance doors, new civic plaza area at Andrew Jackson statue, new planters with native plant and redbuds, dogwoods and maple trees, and a bus shelter will be reinstalled and reopened for the public.

On August 18th the South entrance to the Courthouse and parking lot will be closed to both pedestrians and vehicles. Everyone parking in the South lot and garage will be moved to monthly parking at the 11th and Oak garage. Jackson County will issue monthly parking cards from the garage operator prior to closing the lot.

Other things to look forward to in the coming weeks are: new loading zone for drop-off/pick up of employees on Oak Street, two new disabled parking spaces on Oak Street (close to the accessible walkway), new employee shelter and break area at southeast corner of building, and new perimeter fence around south parking lot and native landscaping. At project completion, the South entrance will be "card access only".

She thanked everyone for their patience, as the work is being done to achieve site and security improvements. The final completion date for the project is expected to be October 30, 2005 which is approximately two months ahead of schedule.

Katheryn Shields talked about another change due to the no smoking policy in the Kansas City Courthouse. She said they will construct an area at the southeast corner of the building that will be protected on two sides and will have a covering over it. It will be a smoking area with tables. When it is completed she will issue an Executive Order to move smokers away from the doors leading through the garage. She has tried to be sensitive to the needs of the employees and the public who smoke by providing this area

Bruce Palmer, Director of Facilities Management, said at the entrance gate off Locust Street there will be a push button intercom. When this is implemented, staff will be available to assist in the process.

Robert A. Stringfield, County Legislator, referred to the 911 Assistance Fund and the balance that Jackson County will have at the end of 2005. He suggested that Jackson County direct its lobbyist to address the issue at the State level. Jackson County may have to pick up the deficit for this every year.

Katheryn Shields said there have been two state-wide votes on extending the 911 surcharge to cell phones and it failed each time. The surcharge is currently only on land lines. Jackson County has authorization from the State to go up to 15%. The County's portion of the 911 surcharge is not generating enough funds to pay for the County's portion of 911. In 2001, the County Legislature voted to increase the surcharge from 1.25% to 2%. Because of the upgrades done by MARC which have additional costs and the fact that land line usage is declining, the funds generated by the County's tax does not equal the percentage of money based on population that is allocated by MARC to the County. She suggested that Chairman Tarwater appoint one or two members from the Legislature to work with MARC on finding a solution.

Katheryn Shields said there was an Intergovernmental Agreement entered into under the Murphy Administration. The agreement allocates the cost based on population of each participating county. There is an oversight board consisting of elected officials and emergency preparedness providers that oversees the running of the 911 system metropolitan wide. She said there is a shrinking taxing base and an expanding service base.

Dan Tarwater, Chairman, agreed that we need to work with the State of Missouri on this issue to get something out to the voters regarding a surcharge on cell phones.

Katheryn Shields explained that the surcharge can be increased up to 15%, it cannot be increased by the County Legislature above 2% without a vote by the citizens of Jackson County.

Dan Tarwater asked that Mr. Holland be present at next week's legislative meeting to discuss the Royals/Chiefs and he asked that notice be given for a closed meeting.

Katheryn Shields introduced Don Saxton, her new appointment on the Board of Services for the Developmentally Disabled.

Scott Burnett said he and Mr. Spence have been working on a RFQ for an evaluation of the drug treatment program. He distributed a schedule, showing that they plan to issue the RFQ in early September, there will be a pre-submission conference and it will be completed in approximately 13 weeks. He thanked Mr. Nunnelly and Mr. Dannaldson for meeting with them on a weekly basis to draft the RFQ. The RFQ is looking for an agency that has experience in evaluating substance abuse programs.

Bob Spence said when the final draft is completed they will send it to the Legislature for their review. He said they hope to send out bids by September 6.

Scott Burnett said he attended the COMBAT picnic on Sunday, August 7th at Swope Park. He said it was a successful event with 15 COMBAT agencies present, all the media and over 1,000 participants.
