5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said that on the agenda is a change order relating to the two new courtrooms in the courthouse annex in Independence. The work is proceeding and those who drop by will be very impressed with how things are looking. Pictures were passed around showing a wide view of Judge Scoville's courtroom, a view of the legislative end of the dual use room, a closeup of the wall paneling and lighting, and the excavation work that was necessary to waterseal the west side on the ground floor. The project is on schedule and the first legislative meeting is scheduled to be held in the new space on Monday, April 9, 2001.

More information has come in on the Kaiser/Coventry Health Care sale. It is anticipated that the sale will be finalized by April 4, 2001. The Blue Ridge and Northland medical offices will be closing Thursday, March 1, but the pharmacies will be open until further notice. The Baptist and Parallel medical offices will not close until Sunday, April 1, 2001.

Personnel has sent a letter out to all of our employees that have Kaiser explaining their options. If they do not make a choice of a primary care physician by March 12, 2001, one will be assigned. Kaiser is adding approximately 30 additional primary care, internal medicine and pediatric physicians to their list of doctors to assist in this transition. Human Resources will continue to update our employees as it becomes available.

Katheryn Shields said there was a story in the Independence Examiner recently about a man who picks up litter in Sugar Creek, MO. That person is Vincent Nelson and he is a supervisor in the Public Works Department. In addition to working hard for Public Works, he does this litter pick up every Sunday. He lives on Kentucky Street and patrols Kentucky between Willow and Carlisle. She thanked Mr. Nelson on behalf of the citizens of Jackson County for the fine work that he does.

It was announced in the charitable giving report that we can be very proud of our employees for making a significant contribution to their community. The total amount of employee giving for 2000 was about \$70,650.00 which is up from last year's total of \$65,000.00.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, said that he has received two different mailings at home on the health insurance. One said that if your current doctor is a part of Coventry then you do not have to fill out a form. The other letter says you have to fill one out anyway.

Katheryn responded that she will ask Joanne Mossie, Director of Personnel, to attend the next legislative meeting to better answer this and any other questions the Legislature might have.


