Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Dennis Waits moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 12/4/2000. Seconded by Bill Petrie.

The motion passed by a voice vote.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, presented at 20 year service pin to Berma Webb, a Recreation Therapist in the Parks and Recreation Department.

Victor E. Callahan asked if the Legislature had a preference of meeting January 2 or January 8, 2001. It was determined that the first regular meeting of the Legislature will be January 2, 2001.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Ken Evans, Public Information Officer, reported that progress is being made on the personal property tax bill problem. Administration wants the taxpayers to know we are working to fix the problem and are asking them to continue to be patient as we work to send out corrected bills. They will be given more time to pay but at this time they can not say what the actual date will be. The Legislature and the taxpayers will be told as soon as a date is known when bills will be going out and when the deadline will be.

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, has hired Severeid & Associates to assist the County with personal property tax bills and other operations involving the Assessment Department. Mr. Severeid is a former Jackson County Assessment Director and handled the first countywide reappraisal in 45 years.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, asked Mr. Evans if he knew how many people have January plates.

Ken Evans said he will get that information. They understand that a receipt is needed and are working with those people as they notify us. It is his understanding that the clerks in the Collections Department are able to make a determination of their taxes and give them a hand written receipt.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, asked how much Severeid & Associates will cost the County. Ken said that it is a three month contract and is about \$8,000.00 a month.

Fred Arbanas asked if Katheryn has money in her budget for the rest of this year or will an Ordinance be coming to the Legislature appropriating money. Ken assumes that has been dealt with already with the Manager of Finance.

Fred Arbanas asked what is going to happen to the entities we collect taxes for? Ken Evans said that we are way ahead in distributions and the amount of taxes we have taken in due to our lock box arrangement with UMB bank.

Fred Arbanas said that there have been several brutal articles about this problem. The County Legislature gets drawn into it and they had nothing to do with the problem. It has been a problem for the Legislature and a problem for the taxpayers and it is time for everyone to know that the County Legislature did not do this.

Terry Young, County Legislator, asked if those who need to get their tags in January pay an incorrect bill or do they get a correct bill to pay?

Susan Reese Duncan, Manager of Administration, responded that there are two options. They can pay the bill that they have or wait for their corrected bill. If they wait for their corrected bill we will issue them a payment in progress which can be used to get their tags.

Victor E. Callahan asked if we have found out what caused this problem.

Ken Evens said that it was a combination of two things. First there was a change in our computer system from Oasis to Ascend and second the drastic changes to the State Valuation Tables. We did not do enough testing to make sure that all of these bills were correct.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, shares his frustration with Fred concerning the Legislature being drawn into some of the adverse discussion and the Legislature has given the Administration what they have asked for. He would like to see someone come in with a plan. Mr. Severeid is not here to answer questions regarding his plan of action. He would like for someone to come in and tell the Legislature about the plan. What are we going to do specifically, and when. He can only speak for himself, but he thinks the Legislature would be happy to do whatever they can to alleviate the problem. But every week they come in here without something consistent about what is going to happen. That's what the public needs to know.

Fred Arbanas commented on the statement made that some people sent their cards back in not filled out correctly. That comment was stated at one of the meetings.

Ken Evans said he is sorry if he was misunderstood, but he is not trying to say that the comment did not come from anyone in the Administration. They do not want any taxpayer to get the message that we are blaming them for the situation. We accept responsibility for it and we will fix it.

Bill Petrie, County Legislator, said it looks like the expertise of Severeid & Associates is in appraisal and he thought it was a computer problem.

Ken Evans said it is both a computer issue and valuation issue of what specific values to put on these vehicles. The state table added a significant number of vehicle types not included the year before. In the translation of the data there were some problems.

Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, said he had dealt with Severeid & Associates in the past and they are real estate. He asked how we came to choose them for the vehicles? Ken said he believes Mr. Severeid could respond to that himself at a later date.

Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, asked if Mr. Severeid would be available to attend the Legislative meeting next week. He is curious about what we are spending money on and what we are going to get. Ken said he will see if Mr. Severeid can attend.
