- 1. Governing Directives: The Subrecipient assures that it shall comply, and all its subcontractors shall comply, with the applicable provisions of the "JAG Solicitation", the "DPS Financial and Administrative Guide", the "DPS Subrecipient Travel Guidelines", any applicable federal nondiscrimination requirements, which may include the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. § 3789d); the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984 (42 U.S.C. § 10604(e)); the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDPA) of 2002 (42 U.S.C. § 5672(b)); the Violence Against Women (VAWA) Act of 2013 (42 U.S.C. 13925(b)(13)); Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d); Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794); Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §§ 12131-34); Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. §§ 1681, 1683, 1685-86); the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. §§ 6101-07); 28 C.F.R. Part 31 (U.S. Department of Justice Regulations - OJJDP Grant Programs); 28 C.F.R. - 4. - 5. <u>Subaward Adjustments</u>: The Subrecipient understands that any deviation from the approved subaward must have prior approval from the Missouri Department of Public Safety. No additional funding shall be awarded to a Subrecipient (unless specifically notified by the Missouri Department of Public Safety of additional funding being awarded), but changes from one budget line to another budget line may be possible if the request is allowable and within the scope of the guidelines. - 6. Monitoring: The Subrecipient agrees to maintain the records necessary to evaluate the effectiveness of the project. In addition, the Subrecipient assures that all documentation or records relating to this subaward shall be made available to monitoring representatives of the Missouri Department of Public Safety, the Office of Missouri State Auditor, the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), the DOJ Office of Inspector General, the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their authorized representatives immediately upon request. The Missouri Department of Public Safety reserves the right to suspend or terminate grant funding pending the review of a report of fraud, waste, or abuse relating to funds under this subaward.

9. Non-Disclosure Agreements: The Subrecipient understands it cannot require any employee or subcontractor to sign an internal confidentiality agreement or statement that prohibits or otherwise restricts, or purports to prohibit or restrict, the reporting (in accordance with law) of waste, fraud, or abuse to an investigative or law enforcement representative of a federal department, the Missouri Department of Public Safety, or other agency authorized to receive such information.

The foregoing is not intended, and shall not be understood by the Subrecipient, to contravene requirements applicable to Standard Form 312 (which relates to classified information), Form 4414 (which relates to sensitive compartmented information), or any other form issued by a federal department or agency governing the non-disclosure of classified information.

In accepting this subaward, the Subrecipient:

- (a) Represents that it neither requires nor has required internal confidentiality agreements or statements from employees or subcontractors that currently prohibit or otherwise currently restrict (or purport to prohibit or restrict) employees or subcontractors from reporting waste, fraud, or abuse as described above; and

- 10. Protection from Reprisal for Disclosures: The Subrecipient understands, pursuant to 41 U.S.C § 4712, an employee or subcontractor may not be discharged, demoted, or otherwise discriminated against as a reprisal for disclosing information that the employee or subcontractor reasonably believes is evidence of gross mismanagement of the funds under this subaward, a gross waste of the funds under this subaward, an abuse of authority relating to the funds under this subaward, a substantial and specific danger to public health or safety, or a violation of law, rule, or regulation related to the funds under this subaward.
- 11. <u>Lobbying</u>: The Subrecipient understands and agrees that, in general, it cannot use any federal funds, either directly or indirectly, to support or oppose the enactment, repeal, modification or adoption of any law, regulation or policy, at any level of government. Furthermore, the Subrecipient understands and agrees that, in general, federal law prohibits federal funds from being used to pay any person to influence (or attempt to influence) with respect to the awarding of a federal grant or cooperative agreement.

As required by 31 U.S.C. § 1352, as implemented by 28 C.F.R. Part 69, the Subrecipient certifles and assures the following:

- (b) If the Subrecipient's request for federal funds is in excess of \$100,000, and any funds other than federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with this federal grant or cooperative agreement, the Subrecipient shall complete and submit Standard Form – LLL, "Disclosure of Lobbying Activities" in accordance with its instructions.
- 12. <u>Fair Labor Standards Act</u>: All Subrecipients of federal funds will comply with the minimum wage and maximum hour's provisions of the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act.

13. <u>Employment of Unauthorized Aliens</u>: Pursuant to <u>Section 285.530.1 RSMo</u>, the Subrecipient assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the State of Missouri, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, the Subrecipient shall sign an affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.

In accordance with <u>Sections 285,525 to 285,550, RSMo</u> a general contractor or subcontractor of any tier shall not be liable when such general contractor or subcontractor contracts with its direct subcontractor who violates subsection 1 of Section 285,530, RSMo if the contract binding the contractor and subcontractor affirmatively states that the direct subcontractor is not knowingly in violation of subsection 1 of Section 285,530, RSMo and shall not henceforth be in such violation and the contractor or subcontractor receives a sworn affidavit under the penalty of perjury attesting to the fact that the direct subcontractor's employees are lawfully present in the United States.

- 14. <u>Relationship</u>: The Subrecipient agrees that it will represent itself to be an independent Subrecipient offering such services to the general public and shall not represent themselves or their employees to be employees of the Missouri Department of Public Safety. (This provision is not applicable to the Missouri Department of Public Safety or any of its divisions or programs.) Therefore, the Subrecipient shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers' compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc.
- 15. <u>Texting While Driving</u>: Pursuant to Executive Order 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," 74 Fed. Reg. 51225 (October 1, 2009), the Missouri Department of Public Safety encourages the Subrecipient to adopt and enforce policies banning employees from text messaging while driving any vehicle during the course of performing work funded by this subaward, and to establish workplace safety policies and conduct education, awareness, and other outreach to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers.
- 16. <u>Drug-Free Workplace</u>: As required by the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, as implemented at 28 C.F.R. Part 83, Subpart F, as defined by 28 C.F.R. §§ 83.620 and 83.650;

The Subrecipient certifies and assures that it will, or will continue to, provide a drug-free workplace by:

- vi. Taking one of the following actions, within 30 calendar days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2), with respect to any employee who is convicted:
 - (1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination, consistent with the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; or
 - (2) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a federal, state, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency; and
- vii. Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f).

Civil Rights:

- 1. Ensuring Access to Federally Assisted Programs: The Subrecipient acknowledges that federal laws prohibit recipients of financial assistance from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, or disability in funded programs or activities, not only in respect to employment practices but also in the delivery of services or benefits. This is a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlining a proposed joint working agreement between the participating agencies to use all applicable regulations, statutes and compliance mechanisms to effectively abate drug and crime related nuisance properties in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

This MOU is made and entered into this _____ day of July, 2019, by and between the City of Kansas City, Missouri (CITY) and the County of Jackson, Prosecuting Attorney's Office (JCPA).

WHEREAS, this MOU provides a suitable mechanism for setting out the mutual responsibilities and obligations of the parties with respect to the establishment and operations of the Jackson County Drug Abatement Response Team (DART) Program; and

WHEREAS, each governing body agrees that the COUNTY shall serve as the fiscal agent for any funds distributed by the Missouri Department of Public Service; and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this MOU is in the best interests of all parties and that the undertaking will benefit the public; and

WHEREAS, each governing body agrees that the DART Program shall be continued under the administration and direction of the Jackson County Prosecutor's Office; and

WHEREAS, the term of this Agreement shall be for twelve (12) months commencing July 1, 2019 and terminating on June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, nothing in this agreement shall impose any liability for claims against the COUNTY; and

WHEREAS, each party to this agreement shall be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by one or more of the parties; and

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS AGREED BY AND AMONG THE PARTIES THE FOLLOWING RESPONSIBILITIES:

JACKSON COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

- a. Will assign two Assistant Prosecuting Attorneys to oversee the filings of expedited evictions, public nuisances, asset forfeitures and related criminal matters.
- Will assign one Trial Team Leader to act as the DART coordinator, who will oversee the operation of DART.
- c. Will assign one paralegal and one investigator to DART.
- d. Will provide notice to property owners of criminal activity and potential litigation.
- e. Will conduct trainings for law enforcement personnel on civil tools to deter crime,
- f. Will collect citizen's complaints regarding drug properties and provide to KCPD.
- g. Will organize regular meetings to discuss problem properties.
- h. Will maintain records of all DART properties.

CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI (Neighborhoods and Housing Services)

- a. Will provide a code enforcement officer to DART. The inspector will be housed within the JCPA offices for a minimum of 12 hours per week. Tentative work schedule is Mondays (12PM-3PM), Wednesday (7AM-3:30PM) and Thursdays (9AM-11:30AM) and subject to change.
- b. Will conduct inspections of properties connected to drug or criminal activity.
- c. Will conduct follow-up inspections on properties deemed uninhabitable.
- d. Will post properties as needed under Ch. 48 and 56 of the City's municipal codes.
- e. Will issue work access permits (when appropriate) to owners and/or residents of DART related cases.
- f. Will provide the necessary documentation for grant reporting purposes (i.e. timesheets, payroll expenditures, status of DART cases, etc.) by the designated deadline.

WHEREAS, the manner in which these services are rendered, the standards of performance, the discipline of the officers and employees, and other matters incident to the performance of these services and the control of personnel so employed, shall remain in the discretion of the respective governing bodies, as applicable, and shall be governed by their respective personnel rules; and

WHEREAS, by entering into this MOU, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those other than those set out herein; further, this MOU shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

We, the undersigned have read and agree with the MOU. Furthermore, we have reviewed the proposed project as outlined in Appendix A and commit to partnering under the terms of this agreement.

APPENDIX A

DART: Purpose and History

The purpose of the DART program is to combat illegal drugs, violence and reduce the harm of criminal activity from Jackson County established a Drug Abatement Response Team (DART) in 1991. Jackson County DART is a collaborative, multi-jurisdictional team created to provide assistance to local citizens by identifying locations where crimes occur, working with homeowners and the community to prevent future crimes and when necessary using legal means to ensure the safety of our communities. Since the inception of Jackson County DART Program, over 9,400 drug houses have been removed from our community.

- a. Jackson County Prosecuting Attorney's Office (JCPA): JCPA is the chief law enforcement agency in Jackson County, Missouri. Led by County Prosecutor (Jean Peters Baker), the office has over 150 total staff which are responsible for prosecuting all criminal and civil cases on behalf of Missouri in the County of Jackson. The office averages filing over 10,000 charges a year based on crimes that occur in 14 different jurisdictions within Jackson County.
- b. City of Kansas City, Missouri (KCMO): is the largest city in Missouri and is the predominant city of a metropolitan area of more than two million people spanning the Missouri-Kansas border. It encompasses 316 square miles (820 km2) in parts of Jackson, Clay, Cass, and Platte counties. It is one of two county seats of Jackson County, the other being Independence, which is to the city's east. The Neighborhoods and Housing Services Department (Neighborhood Preservation Division) is responsible for inspecting and addressing property maintenance and/or nuisance related violations in an attempt to obtain voluntary compliance from homeowners or residents. If voluntary compliance is unsuccessful, other code enforcement actions will be administered including issuing summons or administrative citations to those who refuse to comply.
