5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said the 2nd annual employee lock up and luncheon was held on Friday, September 17, 1999. Staff raised over \$1,700.00 for United Way.

She said a par 3 golf tournament will be sponsored by the Personnel and Parks and Recreation Departments on Tuesday, September 28, 1999 at noon. The cost is \$25.00 per person and proceeds will be donated to United Way.

On Thursday, September 16, 1999 Jackson County participated in "Clean Out Your Files" day. Three tons of recycled material was collected in Kansas City and one ton was collected in eastern Jackson County. Katheryn Shields thanked everyone who participated.

Katheryn Shields reported that the health and dental bids were opened August 31, 1999. The county has received six health bids and six dental bids. These bids will be brought before the Legislature's Ad Hoc Insurance Committee for review and then presented before the entire Legislature. The present contract expires December 31, 1999 but they hope to make a decision by the end of October so open enrollment for employees can be held in November. The new health and dental coverage will go into effect January 1, 2000.

The new Planner Employee Orientation meeting is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, September 21, 1999 at Flemming Hall and this first meeting is sponsored by the County Executive's office. Different departments will sponsor these meetings for new employees. Lunch will be served and prizes will be awarded.

Finally, Steve Covell, Director of MIS, has submitted his resignation effective October 1, 1999. Because we are toward the end of the Y2K process, the County Executive has negotiated a service contract with Steve Covell so he can oversee and monitor the MIS Department, in particular, Y2K conversions through the end of this year. Katheryn Shields said they will do a national search and use a recruiting firm to find a new director for the MIS department. She would like to discuss this process with memebers of the Legislature before she proceeds.

She said they had planned to have a verbal presentation concerning the jail audit performed by Peat Marwick. However, Drew Blossom from the firm is not present today and she asked that this presentation be postponed until next week.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, asked the County Executive what the status was on Y2K preparation and if Jackson County is in compliance. He asked that Steve Covell attend one of the committee meetings next week to discuss Y2K matters. Mr. Covell agreed.

Bob Spence, County Legislator, asked Mr. Covell if there was anything in Jackson County that he could foresee that would not be Y2K compliant by January 1, 2000.

Steve Covell, Director of MIS, responded no. He said presently all desktops and hardware in Jackson County are Y2K compliant. All desktop software is Y2K compliant and there are only two projects left to be completed. One is Legistar, the legislative tracking software which is not installed yet and not being handled by MIS. The other is the collection package which is not scheduled to go live until December 1, 1999. There is another committee to address Y2K matters that are non-computer related and they are meeting October 13, 1999.

Victor E. Callahan said the Legislature has bought \$500 software packages to bring all the computers in the Legislature into compliance. He asked Mr. Covell to attend the Finance and Audit Committee meeting next week to discuss Y2K matters.
