Marsha Campbell, Manager of Administration, responded that the County now has contracted with a private facility in Lathrop, to keep and pay for 35 beds at all times whether we need them or not. The County is utilizing 10-12 County jails in addition to other outside facilities.

James Storkamp, County Counselor, requested a closed meeting on September 19, to discuss tactics and strategies and to answer any questions regarding overcrowding in the jail.
