Dave Kyle, Risk Manager, made a presentation on Jackson County's Y2K readiness. A task force was formed in February and a formal plan was established for the county. An inventory process was started and a planned schedule for what was to take place in the coming months was developed. They have inventoried 25,088 items and recognized that 356 software programs and 750 pc's would need to be taken care of. This process has been ongoing. Vendor letters have been sent out asking if they are Y2K compliant, a Y2K disclosure was developed for our bid process, contingency plans have been developed and a news letter has gone out to all of the county. An outside audit has been done on the Corrections facility and a testing schedule is set up for November. Individuals from the MIS department with be designated for various departments on January 1, 2000 to see how this has all worked out. Some areas are still not completely fixed and they are continuing to work on these areas. They are confident that all of this will be addressed by December 31, 1999.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, asked if people will be brought in on January 1 & 2 to make sure we are up and running.

Dave Kyle responded that people will be brought in and will be supported by the MIS department. Steve Covell added that people will also be here on December 31 to watch the clock roll over to make sure everything is running properly. They will also coordinate with other departments to get representatives in from these departments to go though the full cycle of software and hardware to make sure everything works.

Ronald E. Finley asked the County Counselor if he was correctly informed that the gag order regarding the shackling program had been lifted.

Jane McQueeny, County Counselor, said it is her understanding that the order had been lifted but has not seen an actual copy of the order.

Ronald E. Finley asked if she would check on the actual order. He assumes that they can now discuss this program without constraints and would like to have a response to the motion made a couple of weeks ago regarding what the staff recommendation would be on continuing this program. He also asked about the letter the County Counselor wrote to the State Board of Probation and Parole which asked if they could appear before the Legislature.

Jane McQueeny said that once the gag order was put in place she received a letter from the State Board of Probation and Parole stating they were not going to appear to discuss this matter. Now that the order has been lifted she will again extend the invitation.

Ronald E. Finley mentioned that the Legislature had not received anything on security recommendations for the Court House Annex in Independence and would like a report at the next legislative meeting.
