Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

2 THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, observed a moment of silence in honor of Governor Mel Carnahan, his son Roger, and senior campaign advisor Chris Sifford, who died tragically in a plane crash last week.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

4 HEARINGS

Jim Davis, Acting Director of the Public Works Department, updated the Legislature on the new Public Works Maintenance Facility. The new facility will be located between Grain Valley and Oak Grove. The existing maintenance building has been sold for \$370,000.00 to the City of Independence. Jackson County has paid \$100,000.00 to lease the building for two years while the new facility is being built. The new location is more of a geographic center for Jackson County and consists of 22 acres. Turner Construction Company has been hired as a construction manager and they have prepared an estimate based on the needs of the Public Works Department. Jim Davis presented a drawing of the building and parking area.

Rod Michalka, with Turner Construction Company, went over the budget he presented to the legislators. They have been asked to provide a reasonable projection based on the needs of the Public Works maintenance facility as related to the construction company for the total cost of the project and funding sources. The \$4.43 million figure includes the hard cost of site work, building and equipment. In addition, there are soft costs of land, furnishings, phone and data, professional fees and miscellaneous and owner's contingency in the amount of \$959,000.00 and the \$100,000.00 for rent as mentioned earlier.

In the 2000 budget, Jackson County budgeted approximately \$251,000.00 for earth work to be performed on this project. In addition, costs have already been expended for soil borings and other studies necessary prior to buying the land. Proceeds (\$368,820.00) from the sale of the old building are also available to help offset costs. In the 1999 budget, there were operating funds available (\$136,033.00) for the purchase of the land. The need for the bond placement at \$4.479 million dollars, is based on subtracting the figures mentioned above from the budgeted cost. Bibb and Associates is looking to get the design component of the building done within the next two months and being able to go out for bids the early part of next year and have the building ready by January, 2002.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, asked the price per acre.

Jim Davis responded that the total cost was \$103,000.00.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, has concerns about building near a creek. Jim Davis explained there is a culvert under the railroad tracks. Rod Michalka assured the legislature that a complete study will be done on the issue of flooding prior to setting the final elevation of the building.

Jim Davis said that the Administration, Engineering and Planning Divisions of the Public Works Departments are presently located in the Bundschu Building. The County's lease at the building expires next year. Therefore, in the bond issue another \$1 million dollars has been included so that these offices can be moved to another location in Independence, Missouri. The \$4.5 million is set aside for the Public Works Maintenance Building and \$1 million will be used for the Administration, Engineering and Planning Offices relocation.

Jack Holland said the county will need proceeds of approximately \$5.5 million dollars. The proposal is to utilize the Jackson County Public Building Corporation to issue lease revenue bonds, then lease that facility to Jackson County over a period of 20 years. So the lease payments to pay off the bond will be approximately \$485,000.00 per year for 20 years. Jackson County has used the Public Building Corporation several times in the last 10 years. Most recently it has been used to fund improvements at Truman Medical Center East and the Jackson County Annex.

Ronald E. Finley asked the name of bond counsel. Jack Holland said it is co-bond counsel of Gilmore/Bell and Polsinelli/Shelton.

Jim Davis stated that the new building is the same square footage, however, it is laid out more efficiently.
