WHEREAS, Section 1030.2 of the <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, eliminates the requirement for competitive bidding when items or services required are proposed to be obtained from another government entity; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing recommends the award of a twelve (12) month term and supply contract for the furnishing of forensic neuropathology services for use by the Medical Examiner's Office to OMI Forensic Consultants (Medical Examiner's Office, University of New Mexico), another government entity; and,

WHEREAS, this award is made on an as needed basis and does not obligate the County to pay any specific amount; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that award be made as recommended by the Director of Finance and Purchasing, and that the Director be and hereby is authorized to execute for the County any documents necessary for the accomplishment of this award; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Finance and Purchasing is authorized to make all payments, including final payment on the agreement, to the extent that sufficient appropriations to the using spending agency are contained in the then current Jackson County budget.

Dear Barbara Casemento,

As you may be aware, our office provides a very specialized service to the citizens of Jackson County which includes the medicolegal investigation of death and forensic pathology services. In a few very difficult cases, consultation with other subspecialty experts is necessary. The subspecialty most frequently consulted by our office is Forensic Neuropathology, given the highly specific nature of the consultation, unique qualifications of the consultant, and follow up court testimony on criminal cases. These consultations are often on our most high profile cases and infants and children dying of head trauma. These consultations are necessary in order to document and confirm the diagnosis of abusive head injury, or to help establish the diagnosis of accidental head injury and prevent wrongful prosecutions.

In the U.S. there are very few qualified, experienced, and board certified Forensic Neuropathologists who must pass a minimum of three separate board certifications (Anatomic Pathology, Forensic Pathology, and Neuropathology). Since our forensic pathologists at the Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office are not board certified in neuropathology, we must consult with a board certified neuropathologist to determine cause and manner of death on select cases. We have been pleased with OMI neuropathology consultation services for the past 3 years.

We would respectfully request a purchase from another government for our neuropathology services to be issued to the New Mexico Office of the Medical Investigator.
