#### 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, presented employee awards for July and August, 2000. For the month of July, a team of employees from the Collections Department at the Independence Annex received the award. The team included Paula Bradfield, Donna Jackson, Andrea Marshel and Karen Thompson. Amy Spears was not present.

The August award was presented to Ray Campfield, an animal control officer in the Public Works Department. Katheryn said she would be asking for an additional officer in the budget next year to assist Mr. Campfield.

Katheryn announced that the 2000 Classic Senior Games for people 50+ will be held September 14-17, 2000. This event is sponsored by Jackson County Parks and Recreation in affiliation with the National Senior Games Association.

She invited the legislators to attend the 25th Annual Corrections Volunteer Banquet being held Thursday, September 14 at 6:30 p.m. at the Research Medical Center Student Auditorium. She expressed her sincere appreciation to these volunteers.

Katheryn Shields gave an update on the temporary cooling units at the Kansas City Courthouse. Last week KCP&L had a power surge which blew out power at Trigen. Trigen realized when power was restored that damage had been done to their system. The Detention Facility has been totally on-line since last Thursday. The temporary chillers will be at the Kansas City Courthouse until Wednesday when they can bring the courthouse back on the chilled water loop. However, if high temperatures continue, the chillers may be kept for another week. Most floors in the courthouse are about 74 degrees except the 10th floor which is not that cool. There is an auxiliary chiller at the jail to cool the annex and they may need to bring it over to the Kansas City Courthouse to cool the 10th floor. Trigen has indicated that they will pick up all cost associated with this matter.
