5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said a luncheon was held prior to the legislative meeting for the first department heads as part of the 25th year celebration of the passage of the Jackson County Home Rule Charter. She introduced the department heads who were able to attend. They included Bernice J. Conley, Clerk of the Legislature and first woman elected county-wide in Jackson County and the last elected County Clerk. She was also the first County Clerk appointed after the passage of the Charter. Harvey Jones, County Engineer elected in 1952, then appointed Director of Public Works. Mike White, first elected County Executive under the Charter. Jack McEnroe, first County Auditor under the Charter. Dorothy Johnson, first woman department head for the Department of Health and Welfare under the Charter. Jim Bergfalk, first Director of Corrections and Steve Glorioso, first appointed Director of Records. Katheryn Shields thanked them for starting Jackson County on the right road.
