Fred Arbanas moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 9/9/2002. Seconded by Bill Petrie.

4 HEARINGS

Public hearing regarding the property tax rates of Jackson County, Missouri, Board of Services for the Developmentally Disabled, the Mental Health Fund and the Merchants' and Manufacturers' Inventory Replacement.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, opened the hearing. No one was present to speak on this issue. The hearing was closed.

Mayor Sue Frank of Raytown said she is hoping to enter into an agreement between the Eastern Jackson County Betterment Council, Lee's Summit, Independence, Blue Springs and Jackson County to maintain bus service through the end of the year. She explained that the ATA labor contract requires they bid this program out for the next quarter. She said it is crucial to the elderly, disabled and a great number of citizens of the community. She hopes that the Legislature will consider this matter today.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, explained that this is a stop gap measure for one quarter to get through February 1, 2003.

Mayor Frank explained that this funding is for the main commuter lines. One route runs from Lee's Summit through Raytown to downtown and a like route runs from Blue Springs. She would like to talk to the County further about continuation of service over the next three years.

Mark Swope, ATA representative, said a federal grant funds the two commuter routes in question. They are interjurisdictional commuter routes, they do not service any one community but cross jurisdictional lines. The reason Jackson County is being approached is because it is hard to put together an equitable funding arrangement.

Bob Spence, County Legislator, indicated that he is not prepared to vote on this issue today but has no problem with perfecting it.

Ordinance #3293 was adopted at this time. See page 8 for details.

Victor E. Callahan thanked members of the Legislature for addressing the needs of eastern Jackson County.

Mayor Frank thanked the Legislature for their time and consideration.

Ms. Rogers, a bus rider representative from Blue Springs, thanked the Legislature for passing this legislation.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Troy Thomas, Manager of Finance, referred to the report from the State Tax Commission titled Report on Valuation and Assessment Procedures for Jackson County, Missouri. He introduced Terry Gessley, Deputy Director of Residential Assessment, Bob Burnett, Deputy Director of Commercial Assessment and Steve Glorioso, special consultant to the Assessment Department who were available to present their views and answer any questions regarding the report.

Ronald E. Finley suggested that this report be given during a Finance and Audit Committee meeting since three legislators were absent.

Victor E. Callahan said the County Executive, Katheryn Shields, should also be present when this report is given.

After much discussion on this matter, the Legislature agreed to refer this to the Finance and Audit Committee which is scheduled to meet on Monday, September 23, 2002 at 3:00 P.M. in the Legislative Chambers in Independence, Missouri.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, suggested that staff from the Assessment Department add two columns to their report to reflect delinquent taxes and percentage collectible.
