5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, thanked those who attended the State of the County Address on February 23, 2000. This was a first time event in Jackson County and she was very pleased with its outcome.

She announced that a kickoff was held this morning at Arrowhead Stadium for the "SAFE Schools & Communities" campaign. Katheryn Shields also read a letter from Kansas City Mayor Kay Barnes that was sent to Independence Mayor Stewart regarding her stance on the Jackson County Sales Tax Proposal.

Katheryn Shields said that the sale of the Public Works Facility at 1028 Chrysler has been completed. The sale price was \$268,320.00 and was sold to the City of Independence. This price included the land minus utility costs and lease payments by Jackson County for the next two years. In the meantime we will be designing and building a new Public Works Headquarters between Oak Grove and Grain Valley, Missouri.

The Parks and Recreation Department will be hosting a Slipholder Lottery over the next two weekends for both current and new slipholders. Jackson County offers boat slips at its three major lakes with the most popular being at Blue Springs Lake and the Lake Jacomo South Boat Dock. The Parks and Recreation Department expects to be sold out following the lottery.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, said that the Jackson County Sales Tax is an investment in our future.
