INTERGOVERNMENTAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING HOMELESSNESS TASK FORCE

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into by the City of Kansas City, Missouri, and JACKSON COUNTY, MO

WHEREAS, the Homelessness Task Force was established by the City of Kansas City, Missouri, through Resolution 090788 (attached as Exhibit A), to develop a plan to address the issues associated with homelessness in the Kansas City metropolitan area, which is to include an immediate and long term strategy, as well as funding options, that will be presented to the Kansas City, Missouri City Council for recommendation and implementation; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas City, Missouri City Council has the goal to join with additional governmental entities in the Kansas City metropolitan area to collaborate for a solution to end homelessness throughout the metropolitan area; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kansas City, Missouri and JACKSON COUNTY, MO believe that a joint collaboration would be beneficial to develop a solution to the issues associated with homelessness in the Kansas City metropolitan area; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT AGREED UPON BETWEEN THE CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, AND JACKSON COUNTY, MO THAT:

- 1. The Homelessness Task Force is charged with developing a Plan to address the issues associated with homelessness in the Kansas City metropolitan area and reporting the Plan to the Kansas City, Missouri City Council for recommendation and implementation.
- 2. **JACKSON COUNTY, MO** will join with the Homelessness Task Force to help develop a Plan with immediate and long term strategies and funding options to address issues associated with homelessness.
- 3. JACKSON COUNTY, MO will work with the Homelessness Task Force, and will appoint five (5) representatives to work with the Task Force to participate in the process, to develop a strategy for governmental entities, private businesses and the community to create partnerships for implementation of the approved Plan.



The Chair for the Homelessness Task Force will be responsible for noticing and conducting the joint meetings in accordance to the Homelessness Task Force's rules and procedures.

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that homelessness is a pervasive concern within the city as well as the metropolitan area; and
