WHEREAS, she encourages children under her care to have a relationship with the people that will come to care for these children for the remainder of their lives and

invites the parents to visit in her home; and,

WHEREAS, prior to his death in 2012, Herb was active in the Army and Navy reserves, worked for General Motors at its Leeds Plant, and served as a County Committeeman in the Blue Township for four years; and,

WHEREAS, Opal will retire from foster parenting at the age of 84 when the last baby under her care returns to his biological father this summer; and,

WHEREAS, Opal has numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and also continues to care for children she once fostered, including a young man who is in residential care and visits her each weekend; and,

WHEREAS, in retirement, Opal is looking forward to visiting her children more often, going to the lake, and working in her yard; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the Legislature hereby congratulates Opal Zucca on the occasion of her retirement as a foster parent to numerous children in Jackson County and extends best wishes to her in the future.
