## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said she was contacted by Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, on Friday regarding the Bishop Sullivan Center. The Center was asking for help because the heat was affecting their senior citizens very severely. Dan Tarwater assured the Administration that he had the support of the Chairman of the Legislature, Victor E. Callahan. Therefore, the Administration contacted the Center and told them if they would go out and purchase \$5,000.00 worth of air conditioning units for the elderly, Katheryn Shields, County Executive, would request the Legislature to approve sending \$5,000.00 to Bishop Sullivan Center for this expenditure. She stated that there is an add-on Resolution on the agenda today regarding this matter.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked where the Bishop Sullivan Center was located.

Troy Thomas, Manager of the Division of Finance, said the Center is located at 6435 Truman Road.

Bob Spence, County Legislator, asked if the money was for the actual air conditioning units or for salary.

Jay Haden, County Counselor, explained that because of the Missouri Constitution the County cannot extend its credit or give money away. Therefore, the County has looked for parts of the program that it can legally fund such as subsidizing salaries or direct assistance.

Katheryn Shields asked Carol Lillis to come forward. She commended Carol for doing such a great job in organizing the food donation for Harvesters this year. Jackson County collected almost 5,000 pounds of food plus \$1,288.00 for the hungry in our community. She stated that Harvesters is also recognizing Carol for her outstanding job in coordinating this effort in Jackson County.

Katheryn Shields announced that on Saturday, September 23, 2000, Jackson County Parks and Recreation is looking for volunteers to combine efforts with thousands across the nation in the 15th Annual International Coastal Cleanup Day. We use this day to cleanup the shorelines of our lakes.
