Katheryn Shields, County Executive, thanked those Legislators who attended the rededication of the Courthouse in Kansas City. She also thanked them for the support given to her administration so this beautiful historic building could be preserved. The building opened in 1934 and was a beautiful example of art deco with classical illusions connected to it. When she came into office in 1995, the building was pretty "used up." Water was seeping into the limestone, the windows had 50% air penetration, the north plaza had begun to sink and the only handicap entrance was through the garage. There were many things that needed to be done to preserve this building and make it function well for the citizens for another 70 years. All of these things have been accomplished with the help of the Legislature.

Dan Tarwater said that the whole courthouse looks great and congratulated Katheryn on doing a great job.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, thanked the County Executive for her hard work on this project and said she did a tremendous job of explaining to the Legislature the problems with the building.
