## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said some legislators have indicated that they would like to tour the Fort Osage Education Center to see what progress is being made. Her staff has talked to the City of Buckner and they have agreed to let us use their Town Hall for a future legislative meeting. The Town Hall is only about 5 minutes from the Education Center so after the meeting legislators could take a quick trip to the Fort Osage Education Center for a tour. Tours are available any Monday after November 17th so she asked legislators to let her know when they would like to visit so she can schedule it.

Katheryn Shields spoke about an article in the Kansas City Star that had a number of misstatements in it that need to be cleared up.

She said over the 12 years she has been at the County, she has had good relations with the County Legislature. They may not have always agreed with each other but have worked together for the common goal of what is best for Jackson County.

The first sentence of the article is incorrect. It reads "In 1997, Jackson County told the public that it would spend \$6.1 million in bond money for courtroom improvements." It is a misstatement because the bond indentures index, under Series 99 projects, it describes the general project it speaks clearly about expansion, renovation, remodeling, improvement, furnishing and equiping of courtrooms for Kansas City and Independence. However, in the project description it not only refers to the schedule but it also says "and any project additions as that may at any time exist in any other facilities financed with the proceeds of these 1997 bonds." Clearly the project was larger than just courtroom improvements.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, said we added three working courtrooms to the Independence Annex.

Katheryn Shields said the additional plan was to put a new roof on the courthouse annex. Heating and cooling improvements were also included in the initial planning and have been done. She said the voters rejected the ballot measure to build a new courthouse in Independence. There were original funds left over as well as fund accumulated through interest.

#### 14 NEW BUSINESS

Rhonda Shoemaker, County Legislator, recommended that the legislative auditor audit the 1997 and 2005 bond funds as well as the 2006 personal services contracts. She also asked Bob Spence to help with the scope on the bond fund audit since he worked with a CPA firm. She said it was suggested to out source this work but she believes it can be done in-house.

Henry C. Rizzo asked what Rhonda wanted to accomplish with this audit.

Rhonda Shoemaker said she would like an internal audit to find out where the bond proceeds have been spent.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, said the financial advisor, Jack Holland, should be involved since he could show where bond money was spent.

Bob Spence, County Legislator, said he thinks the legislative auditor should be involved. He said it is a simple process. Read the bond indenture, audit the expenditures/bond money and see if it went for purposes that the bond indenture allowed. He thinks it should include the 2006 bond money.

Rhonda Shoemaker said she would like to know how the bond money was spent from 1997 - 2006.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, said he agrees that the legislative auditor should be involved. He suggested Rhonda Shoemaker introduce a Resolution to get this done.

Jay Haden, Deputy County Counselor, said the Finance and Audit Committee directs the actions of the auditor. Therefore, Rhonda would present her written request to the Finance and Audit Committee and the committee will then vote on it.

Katheryn Shields thinks that the financial advisor, Jack Holland or bond counsel, Gilmore and Bell or Herb Hardwick should also be involved.

Fred Arbanas said Rhonda's request should also ask for the amount of money remaining in each account.

Henry C. Rizzo said any legislator who wants to include something in the scope should give it to Rhonda to include in her request.

Rhonda Shoemaker said she has four questions regarding personal service contracts: (1) When are contracts entered into? (2) What is the substance/purpose of the contracts? (3) What accounts were they paid from? (4) When was the County Legislature notified?

Katheryn said they would get the answers.
