5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, submitted the recommended budget for 1995. She thanked the Legislature for allowing the Legislative Auditor and his assistant to sit in on the budget hearings held in December. She thanked the Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff and Circuit Court budget committee as well as all departments who worked with her and Walt Van Asselt, Manager of Finance, in making budget reductions. The 1995 budget includes a pool of 2% for salary increases which the Legislature may decide how to disburse.

Also reflected in the budget is one million dollars for the boarding out of prisoners. Katheryn Shields reported that the Administration has been working with Claudia York, the attorney who brought the action against Jackson County concerning jail overcrowding. Katheryn Shields and Claudia York made a joint motion to Judge Whipple to allow more time to review requisitions for proposal sent by the prior Administration and come back to the court with an amended plan. The order is stayed regarding the prior plan and time frame. Jackson County has been given an additional 30 days to present a plan. Also in the budget is a position for a Population Control Coordinator for the jail.

Fred Arbanas said he was happy that Katheryn Shields spoke with Claudia York and said he is willing to sit on the jail committee.

Dixie Flynn asked when the Legislature will discuss the 2% salary increase.

James D. Tindall replied, it will be discussed at the end of budget hearings.

Fred Arbanas asked the Administration for a report on overspending in 1994. Katheryn Shields said administration will prepare the report and make it available at the budget hearing this week.

Katheryn Shields supports a \$15,000.00 budget for the Jackson County Ethics Commission which was not included in the recommended budget for 1995.
