Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Fred Arbanas moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 6/12/2000. Seconded by Terry Young.

4 HEARINGS

Bob Beaird, Prosecuting Attorney, said that the National Institute of Justice was going to discuss the ADAM program. The Prosecutor's office has the cooperation of all the police agencies that run the detention facilities (Kansas City, Lee's Summit, Grandview, Independence, Blue Springs and Raytown). Randomly, four times a year, they monitor the people who are arrested by using urine tests, questionnaires, etc., to try to ascertain what drugs are used in Jackson County, what drugs are used in specific areas in Jackson County and the classification of people who are using various drugs. It brings together the information for the people who need it namely law enforcement. Arrestees participate based on anonymity and no cost is incurred.

Nora Fitzgerald from the National Institute of Justice said they are thrilled to bring this program to Jackson County. The NIJ has been running this research program for over ten years in major urban centers around the country. Kansas City/Jackson County was in this system earlier when it was call the Drug Use Forecasting Program (DUF). Now it has been expanded into the Arrestee Drug Abuse Monitoring Program (ADAM). Jackson County will be joining 35 other counties in the country where the NIJ is systematically collecting data on people arrested for all types of charges to learn things about their drug use.

Ms. Fitzgerald said that Phyllis Newton, Project Director with ABT & Associates in Washington, is managing the implementation at all the sites.

Phyllis Newton said this is a local program which will provide Jackson County with information in a more timely fashion than is possible with other data collection tools around the country. This will be done four times a year and the data will be sent back to Jackson County within 30 to 45 days after the information is collected. ADAM is, for the first time, a probability based sample which will allow Jackson County to say with confidence this is what is going on in this jurisdiction. This instrument looks at demographics, treatment, market information, contact with the criminal justice system and drug involvement in the last year. This information will be valuable in the community. This system is also trying to show relationships among the different aspects of this program such as age, race, residency and geo coding. This is a joint project between Jackson County and the National Institute of Justice, each contributing approximately \$50,000.00. Jackson County had expressed an interest in this program and was chosen to participate.

There is much discussion on the above topic.
