5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said the editorial in the Kansas City Star today referred to Oppenstein Park located at 12th and Walnut in downtown Kansas City, Missouri. The Star called it "a crucial downtown intersection" and "a development that should benefit Kansas Citians for many years to come."

Through a partnership between Jackson County, the Downtown Community Improvement District, the City of Kansas City and the Police Department, dramatic changes were made in only a few months. This is a park that had developed problems with drug dealers and vagrants and downtown workers avoided using the park. Jackson County Parks Department invested \$50,000.00 making physical changes to the park to make it more attractive to the general public. Food vendors now set up in the park and there are free concerts for downtown employees to enjoy.

Katheryn Shields handed out a map showing the watersheds in the county, as a stormwater item appears on the agenda today. Resolution #14701 deals with a grant from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources in the amount of \$89,000.00 for the watershed assessment portion of the effort.

In October 2002, the Jackson County Stormwater Commission was formed to create a comprehensive stormwater management plan for Jackson County since watersheds cross political boundaries.

She said our approach is different because we are identifying natural resources, protecting and enhancing them to better manage stormwater. Jackson County is looking for regional solutions to regional problems. We want to be proactive, get out ahead of development and prevent future flooding and we are looking for "green" solutions. Our objective is to identify and create systems to reduce flooding, enhance water quality and provide recreation and wildlife opportunities.

She is proud that Jackson County is both proactive and "green" in our approach and is happy that this is a cooperative project with the County Legislature and other cities and counties in the metro area. She thanked the Legislature for their support.

She reminded everyone that this Friday is "Red Friday", when volunteers sell special newspapers for Chiefs charities. She encouraged everyone to wear red and to support their colleagues outside the courthouse who are participating in this annual event.

Katheryn Shields prepared a handout for members of the Legislature based on the questions they asked last week about the budget for the Circuit Court. The handout showed comparisons of funding for the Courts from the State and County. The information revealed that Jackson County's contribution has been growing each year while State funding has been flat for several years.

She said Michael O'Flaherty, Director of Assessment, will update the Legislature on his plans for implementing Certificate of Value in Jackson County later in the meeting.

Michael O'Flaherty, Director of Assessment, provided a copy of the newly designed form for Certificates of Value to members of the County Legislature. Certificate of Value (COV) is a document filed in the Recorder's office at the time of sale, at no additional cost to the property owner, which reports the sale price of any real property filed. It will be used in the Assessor's office to more accurately estimate the market value of real estate properties.

He said the Certificates of Value would go into effect on January 1, 2004. He met with people in St. Charles, St. Louis City and St. Louis County and as a result came up with the form he handed out. He said the original form was quite intimidating which is the reason he deleted information that was not necessary on the new proposed form. A public information campaign is scheduled to start in mid-September and end in mid-October. He invited suggestions from the County Legislature and will also get input from the real estate board.

Henry Rizzo, County Legislator, asked Mr. O'Flaherty for an explanation of each question on the form and why the information is necessary so when his constituents ask he will have the answer.

Michael O'Flaherty said he would be happy to provide that information.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, asked if the general public will know what "arms length" means.

Michael O'Flaherty responded that it means "me selling to you rather than one of my children."
