5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Mike Sanders, County Executive, said he attended the National Association of Counties (NACO) Conference held last week in Richmond, Virginia. He said there were roughly 5,000 attendees in Virginia, which included guests and family members. He said it was big event and Hillary Clinton spoke at the conference. Next year, Jackson County will host the conference in July 2008 which will be a great opportunity to showcase all the great work going on in Jackson County and Kansas City and surrounding communities.

With regards to deferred maintenance, Mike Sanders said it was discussed in committee about the electrical equipment and the circuit breakers. He said they are finding a litany of items that the County has not maintained in a number of years that pose some risk to the County. In a couple of weeks the Administration will come before the County Legislature with a list of repair projects. He said the electrical emergency (R. #16360) is a risk not only to the physical safety of employees but also to the important records kept by County departments. Finally, he reiterated Bob Spence's point, that there is no money in the general fund to pay for this so the money will be taken from the contingency fund. This is the first time in years that Jackson County has had to dip into the fund, an example of the difficult financial situation the county is facing.

The COMBAT Review Commission will meet on August 1, 2007 from 6 - 8 P.M. at the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (across from Truman Sports Complex), 8701 Leeds Road, Kansas City, MO. They will also meet on August 9, 2007 from 6 - 8 P.M. at the Pioneer Building located at 18th and Prospect. During these public hearings they will be asking for public input on what they want COMBAT to look like in the years going forward.

Mike Sanders said Jackson County announced two weeks ago the prescription drug plan at the request of Fred Arbanas. He said they have received incredible feedback on the plan. Roughly 90,000 cards have been distributed to date.

He introduced Shelley Temple-Kneuvean, whom he appointed Deputy Chief Administrative Officer. (Executive Order 07-23)

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, said the 911 tax needs to be shared between land lines and cell phone users. He stressed the importance of having a good effort in Jefferson City to promote this legislation.

Mike Sanders responded that he has spoke to the lobbyists about this issue. He said the Administration will come before the County Legislature in a few weeks to discuss the legislative agenda and the 911 issue is one of the foremost items. He said this is a national problem not just a local or statewide problem.

Theresa Garza, County Legislator, asked if COMBAT meetings will be held in other areas such as South Kansas City, Grandview, Lee's Summit, Waldo or Brookside.

Mike Sanders replied that the two meetings he mentioned earlier are scheduled by the commission. He said neither the Executive Office nor the County Legislature are involved in the process. They will be using Jackson County's web site to notice the meetings and he will let everyone know when the site is available. The commission is planning to bring the finished product some time in September 2007.

Henry C. Rizzo, County Legislator, asked Mike Sanders to ask the Finance Department to monitor the 911 tax and when it reaches a surplus to advise the County Legislature so they can review it.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, asked the start date for streaming video.

Mary Jo Spino, Clerk of the County Legislature, said it is tentatively set for August 13, 2007.

Michele Newman, Acting Director of Parks and Recreation, welcomed everyone to the Fort Osage National Historic landmark. She thanked the County Legislature for having the meeting at this location so they could showcase the new Fort Osage Education Center. It is still under construction but the official opening will occur in mid to late September 2007.

She introduced Ron Fuhrken, Deputy Director of Park Operations. Ron is the landscape architect and he is over planning and development in the park system. He worked closely with the architect team during the design process of Fort Osage Education Center.

She introduced Gordon Julich, Superintendent of Historic Sites and Outdoor Education. He has an extensive background in construction management as well as historic preservation.

She said Ron and Gordon have been working on the Fort Osage project for the past 6 years. Additionally, they represented Jackson County in terms of forging partnerships with state and federal agencies which have also contributed to this project.

For those who took the tour, Michele said she hopes they found the design, technology and displays both remarkable and unique. The Lewis and Clark Expedition camped below this site and its strategic location so impressed William Clark that he returned to this spot in 1808 and initiated the construction of what we see today as Fort Osage. In recognition of its role in our history the Department of Interior designated Fort Osage as a national historic landmark, an honor reserved only for sites demonstrating significant influence in our national heritage. Michele said there are only 3 other national historic landmarks in Jackson County and only 36 throughout the State of Missouri. The Federal Government has included Fort Osage on the National Register of Historic Places as an archeological district because of its cultural remains of the Hopewell Indians and a certified site of both the Santa Fe and Lewis and Clark National Historic Trails. The education center was not only conceived to support Fort Osage and its historic significance but it also had an educational component and mission. The educational mission was to educate students about their past, about their Missouri heritage, as well as guidance and responsible stewardship for our future.

Gordon Julich was present to talk about the philosophy of the design of the building, the educational component, as well as the environmental component.
