Fourteenth Regular Meeting

Scott Burnett, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

1 ROLL CALL

2 THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Dennis Waits to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on March 26, 2018. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Theresa Galvin, Chair of the Inter-Governmental Affairs Committee, introduced the Legislature's Chief Inter-Governmental Relations Consultant Fred Dreiling and Noel Torpey, Assistant Inter-Governmental Relations Consultant.

Mr. Dreiling stated the Missouri House has worked on a budget that includes a \$3.9 million increase to draw down the state's amount it owes counties for inmate per diem. The current per diem is \$22.58 per inmate, a fraction of what the County must pay for inmate costs. A budget has been passed by the House but the Senate's version, which has been perfected, must go through fiscal review. He stated that it is likely that the final budget will undergo some revisions in the final weeks of the Legislature's term.

Mr. Torpey reported that he and Mr. Dreiling testified on the 911 bill. He stated that a 911 Board was created last year and the Board released its findings in a report to the Senate last week. The report stated that Missouri's 911 system is out-of-date, under funded, and antiquated. Mr. Torpey stated that this bill, sponsored by Representative Jeanie Lauer, will hopefully be adopted this year.

Mr. Dreiling also reported on the matter of Missouri's prevailing wage law. He stated some alternatives to the prevailing wage law have been proposed in the Senate.

Mr. Dreiling addressed the issue of stadium funding, stating that he expects Senators Rizzo and Holsman to add an amendment to include our stadiums to a current bill related to funding for the St. Louis Blues Hockey team.

Mr. Dreiling and Mr. Torpey also stated that they testified in opposition to a bill that will prevent local jurisdictions from adding restrictions on where individuals with conceal and carry permits may bring their guns.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Frank White, County Executive, introduced Mike Lewis and Steve Davis from Shive Hattery Architecture + Engineering to speak about a Feasibility and Master Plan - Phase I and II for the Jackson County Criminal Justice System.

Mr. Lewis and Mr. Davis reported on the company's plans to conduct a systemic analysis of the County's Criminal Justice System. The first two phases will be completed within four months. Phase I will include data collection and recommendations focusing on protecting the public while providing appropriate care of those incarcerated and reducing recidivism, and developing an offender management and strategy program that expedites adjudication and establishes goals for the on-going phases of work.

Phase II will include a feasibility study to apply the data analysis toward long-term solutions that will either propose renovation of the existing facility, building a new facility, or a combination of these two solutions.
