## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Victor Ferrara, a plumber in the Facilities Management Department, was named April 2001 Employee of the Month. Victor has been a plumber with Jackson County for over 14 years and about a year ago, he took on the responsibilities of 2 plumbers when his colleague fell ill for an extended period of time.

Kristi Lewis, Administrative Assistant in the Prosecutor's office, was named June 2001 Employee of the Month. In early summer, the Prosecutor's office installed 24 new PC's. Kristi installed 14 of them and took the initiative to repair 3 computers that did not work out of the box. She also assisted the Bad Check Unit with their computer problems.

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said last week about 20 Jackson County officials, including herself, met with Governor Holden's new Homeland Security Advisor Colonel Tim Daniels. They discussed the state of security and security needs at both the state and local levels and ways in which our coordinated efforts could ensure the safety of all Jackson County residents. As a result of the meeting, Katheryn asked MARC to put together a group with representatives from local counties on both sides of the state line, to focus on more coordinated security effort for this region.

She said that last Friday both courthouses hosted Jackson County's annual Halloween Celebration. Children from Operation Breakthrough and Sunshine Center dressed up and helped us celebrate Halloween as well as the children of employees.

Katheryn Shields announced that Saturday, November 3, 2001, Jackson County's Adair Park will be hosting the first ever local computer and small television recycling drive from 9 A.M. to 1 P.M. This drive is sponsored by MARC and is designed for individuals not businesses, at this time. Citizens can bring their old computers, computer monitors and televisions, up to 19 inches, to be recycled. Computer system and peripheral equipment recycling comes at no cost. Televisions and computer monitors have a cost and for more information please call 474-4240. This event is also being held in conjunction with America Recycles Day.

Ed Severeid, Director of Assessment, explained that there are 46 taxing jurisdictions in Jackson County. He said the assessor should probably communicate with these jurisdictions at least 3 or 4 times per year to keep them informed.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, asked if the school superintendents were notified that the Assessment Department was cleaning up the personal property tax rolls, which in effect reduced anticipated revenues.

Ed Severeid said there was no communication with the school districts or any of the taxing entities about the County project which reduced revenues.

Victor E. Callahan asked if a policy would be put in place to notify school districts in the future.

Ed Severeid said in the future school districts and other taxing entities will be notified and kept informed.
