5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, announced that she has nominated Richard Nadeau and he has been selected by Jay Nixon, to serve on the Board of Directors of "A Rising Tide - the Greater Kansas City Health Care Foundation." This foundation will determine the best use of funds from the sale of Health Midwest. She said Richard has strong educational credentials and many years' experience serving the health care needs of the citizens in the Kansas City metro area. He has been in private practice since 1974 conducting individual, couple and family psychotherapy. He has been a strong leader in Jackson County's mental health initiative, has served on the Mental Health Levy Board and as Chairman of the Mental Health Court Task Force. Katheryn thanked him for his willingness to serve.

She also made two other appointments by Executive Order but the persons appointed were unable attend the legislative meeting today. She appointed Ron Bremer to serve on the Community Advisory Committee of "A Rising Tide - The Greater Kansas City Health Care Foundation." She appointed Robert M. Hernandez to the Office of Human Relations and Citizens Complaints Commission.

Katheryn Shields presented a check in the amount of \$16,000.00 to Sister Berta Sailor from St. Vincent's Operation Breakthrough. Operation Breakthrough is the charity for the County Executive Benefit Golf Tournament.

Katheryn said the Heartland Chapter of the American Muslim Council held its annual dinner on Saturday, with a sellout crowd of 300 people. The Chief Administrative Officer, Art Chaudry, is past-president of the this organization. Other members participated in Jackson County's Diversity Task Force, which was formed just after September 11th. One of the group's honorees this year is County Legislator, Scott Burnett. He won the "Public Service Award." She congratulated him.

At the same event, Katheryn Shields accepted an award for "individual achievement in mental health awareness." She thanked the County Legislature for their support of Jackson County's mental health initiative.

This year, the County Executive nominated the Records Department for an Environmental Excellence Award from Bridging the Gap and they won. From reusing office supplies, to printing marriage licenses on recycled paper, they are making a difference. Staff in the Records Department have saved tax dollars by using two-sided copies, using coffee mugs instead of Styrofoam cups, using energy-efficient light bulbs and turning outdated forms into office note pads. It is also the leading department in E-government. The ability of citizens to search county records on-line saves time, money and the environment. She gave a special thank you to Sandae Custard from the Records Department and a long time member of the Recycling Committee.

She recognized Jim Meredith, an employee from Facilities Management, for receiving the Individual Award from the Mid-America Regional Council's Solid Waste Management District. Jim also serves on the Jackson County Recycling Committee. He was the first county employee to recycle cardboard and to deliver plastics to Union Station for recycling. He was instrumental in the development of the county's reuse center for small office supplies. He initiated cardboard and paperboard recycling at the Fred Arbanas Golf Course and has assisted in expanding recycling programs in county buildings in Independence. She thanked Jim for his service to Jackson County and congratulated him on his award.

13 UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, said he was surprised to read in the paper that the bi-state issue would be on the ballot.

Katheryn Shields said she too was surprised, so she called the paper and explained that the heading and first paragraph of the article were incorrect. As a result, on Thursday a corrected story was printed. She commended the Kansas City Star for their prompt attention to this matter.

Dennis Waits, Chairman, said the financing will be difficult to arrange and bringing together these Memorandums of Understanding for the Chiefs and Royals would not be easy. However, since it will be very worthwhile the Legislature needs to support the County Executive in her efforts.

Henry Rizzo, County Legislator, said the County Legislature wants to be included in this issue. He said it is not just a Jackson County issue but pertains to the metropolitan area.

Katheryn Shields agreed that the Chiefs and the Royals are metropolitan assets. Today Jackson County has forty percent of the population and forty percent of the resources. Jackson County alone cannot make major improvements to the stadiums without help on a larger basis. She has been working on this issue with civic leaders since 1998.

Robert A. Stringfield, County Legislator, said he was appointed to the bistate commission by the Jackson County Legislature in March 2003. He asked what this body wanted him to do as member of the commission regarding bistate.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked Mr. Stringfield to provide copies of the minutes of the commission to members of the legislature so they could be informed.

Robert Stringfield said he would provide copies to the County Legislature and Executive. He gave a copy of the annual report to the Clerk of the County Legislature, Mary Jo Spino, so she could make copies for the Legislature and Executive.

Henry Rizzo said it is important that the County Legislature and County Executive speak as one on this issue.
