COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

AN AGREEMENT by and between JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, hereinafter called "the County" and NORTHEAST KANSAS CITY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, 6400 Independence Ave., Kansas City, MO 64125, hereinafter referred to as "Chamber."

WHEREAS, the County and Chamber desire to enter into an Agreement to provide funding to be used for its Healthy Businesses/Healthy Residents Program; and,

WHEREAS, the County deems it to be in the best interest of its citizenry to support such programs and activities; and,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, the County and Chamber respectively promise, covenant, and agree with each other as follows:

- 1. <u>Services</u>. Chamber shall provide services through its Healthy Businesses/Healthy Residents Program, as is more fully set out in the proposal attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.
- Terms of Payment. The County shall pay to Chamber a total amount not to exceed \$5,000.00 under this Agreement, which shall be used to provide services in the amounts listed on the attached Budget. One quarter of this sum, or \$1,250.00, shall be paid to Chamber on a quarterly basis provided that Chamber has submitted to the County the report(s) required under Paragraph 3 and Paragraph 4 hereof. Payment for the first and second quarter will be issued within 30 days after the contract has been executed by all necessary parties. The County, through the Legislative Auditor, may

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approve adjustments to line items listed in Chamber's budget/proposal contained in Exhibit A, in an amount not to exceed 10 percent of the total amount of the Agreement, so long as there is no additional total cost to the County.

- 3. Reports. Within 30 days after the conclusion of each calendar quarter under this Agreement, Chamber shall submit a quarterly report, including cancelled checks and/or a copy of the face of the check and corresponding bank statements, invoices, and any other documents requested by the Director of Finance and Purchasing, to establish that the funds provided pursuant to this Agreement were used for the purposes set forth herein. The report for the first and second quarter shall be submitted within 30 days after the execution of this Agreement. The last quarter's report shall include an annual report which shall summarize all of Chamber's activities pursuant to this Agreement. Chamber's failure to submit this annual report shall disqualify Chamber from future funding by the County.
- 4. <u>Submission of Documents</u>. No payment shall be made under this contract unless the contracting agency shall have submitted to the Director of Finance and Purchasing (1) a written proposal setting out in detail the intended use of the County's funding, including the target population to be served; (2) the agency's IRS Form 990, from the previous fiscal or calendar year; (3) a statement of the agency's total budget for its most recent fiscal year; and, (4) a detailed explanation of actual expenditures of County funds (pertains to final payments and payments on contracts for future years.) If an agency has previously received County funding, to be eligible for future payments, an agency must submit either an audited financial statement for the agency's most recent fiscal or calendar year, by March 31 of the following year, or a

certified public accountant's program audit of County funds, by January 31 of the following year. Any document described herein which was submitted to the Director of Finance and Purchasing as a part of an application for funding need not be resubmitted to qualify for payment. No payment shall be made if the contract agency is out of compliance on any other County contract.

- 5. **Equal Opportunity**. Chamber agrees and assures that no person eligible for services shall on the ground of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, handicap, veteran status, or age be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination for any service funded by this Agreement. Furthermore, Chamber agrees and assures that it will provide equal employment opportunities to applicants and employees and will not discriminate against them on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, handicap, veteran status, or age.
- 6. Audit. The County further reserves the right to examine and audit, during reasonable office hours, the books, and records of Chamber pertaining to its finances and operations.
- 7. **Default.** If Chamber shall default in the performance or observation of any term or condition of this Agreement, the County shall give written notice setting forth the default and the correction required. If said default shall continue and not be corrected by Chamber within ten days of its receipt of said notice, the County may, at its election, terminate the Agreement and withhold any payments not yet made. Said election shall not in any way limit the County's right to seek legal redress.
- 8. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. Chamber warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall in any manner whatsoever be interested in

or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.

- 9. <u>Employment of Unauthorized Aliens Prohibited</u>. Pursuant to §285.530.1, RSMo, Chamber assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the State of Missouri and/or Jackson County, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, Chamber shall sign an affidavit, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B, affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.
- 10. <u>Severability</u>. If any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid or incapable of being enforced by reasons of any rule of law or public policy, all other conditions and provisions of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.
- Appropriation of funds. Chamber and the County recognize that the County intends to satisfy its financial obligation to Chamber hereunder out of funds annually appropriated for that purpose by the County. County promises and covenants to make its best efforts to appropriate funds in accordance with this Agreement. In the event no funds or insufficient funds are appropriated and budgeted, or are otherwise unavailable by any means whatsoever for payment due hereunder, County shall immediately notify Chamber of this occurrence and this Agreement shall terminate on the last day for which appropriations were received, without penalty or expense to the

County of any kind whatsoever, except as to the portions of the payment amounts herein agreed upon for which funds shall have been appropriated and budgeted or are otherwise available, or at any time after the last date that County has paid for the Services, if earlier.

County further agrees:

- a. That any funds authorized or appropriated for services rendered under this Agreement shall be applied to the payments hereunder until all such funds are exhausted.
- b. That County will use its best efforts to obtain authorization and appropriation of such funds including, without limitation, the inclusion in its annual budget, a request for adequate funds to meet its obligation under this Agreement in full.
- 12. <u>Liability and Indemnification</u>. No party to this Agreement shall assume any liability for the acts of any other party to this Agreement, its officers, employees or agents and Chamber shall indemnify, defend and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, damages, costs (including reasonable attorney's fees directly related thereto) including but not limited to violation of civil rights and/or bodily injury to or death of any person and for damage to or destruction of property if and to the extent caused by the negligence, willful misconduct or omissions of Chamber during the performance of this Agreement.
- 13. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall be effective January 1, 2013, and shall terminate on December 31, 2013. This Agreement may be terminated prior to that date by either party upon written notice, delivered thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination. If this Agreement is terminated by either party, the County shall pay only

for those services actually performed by Chamber as verified by the County's audit.

14. <u>Incorporation</u>. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.
