5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said Steve Marsh with the GIS Department found money in the hallway if anyone lost it.

She reported that the Mangrove Human Resources/payroll system was implemented last week and the first round of paychecks using the new system were processed on Friday. The Mangrove Implementation team consists of key personnel from Human Resources, Finance and MIS and she thanked them for a successful transition. She specifically thanked Thad Thomas, Jeremy Willmoth and Rochelle Neal.

Katheryn said the budget for the FMS and Mangrove systems was slightly over one million dollars and we are under budget. She said this is another successful e-government effort.

She announced that there are 5 employee of the month awards to be presented and all are employees of the Parks and Recreation Department.

The July Employee of the Month Award was presented to Aaron Gunzel and Thomas Warford. Aaron and Thomas received the award due to their efforts for helping save a person who nearly drowned at Longview Lake on June 10th this year.

The August Employee of the Month Award was presented to Charles Loring and Larry Niederschulte. On June 17th, Charles came upon a Parks patron passed out in his car with a suicide note. Charles called for assistance and was able to wake the victim and keep him calm, while Larry called the police and appropriate medical agencies.

The September Employee of the Month Award was presented to Robert Henderson for quick response to a medical emergency at Longview Marina.

Henry C. Rizzo congratulated Scott Burnett as his house was on the Roanoke's home tour.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, said his home is 105 years old. He said Jennifer Berry, another County employee, had open house also in the Hyde Park neighborhood.

Scott Burnett said the Finance and Audit Committee had a 4 1/2 hour meeting last Thursday with the insurance brokers. The proposal that resulted is that the brokers would have a fixed price for commission. This saved the County money. Coventry initially indicated that the increase this year would not go up more than 14 1/2%. However, because of the savings in the commission area, Coventry's increase will only be 13.6%. Jackson County will continue with Coventry in 2007. Scott said he asked the brokers to come to the Finance and Audit Committee on the first Monday of every month to give a report.

Bob Spence, County Legislator, congratulated Scott Burnett, Dan Tarwater and Henry C. Rizzo for their hard work on this issue. He said they saved the County money and are looking forward to more savings in the future.

Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, said another reason for the discussion was to find out who employees could call for help with health insurance issues. He thanked CBIZ and McDaniel/Hazley.

Scott said the Legislature has asked the brokers to set up a 1-800 number for callers. They also asked the brokers to review a communications plan with Scott Burnett and the Finance and Audit Committee.
