5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, reminded the Legislature that on Friday, July 24, 1998, at 11:00 a.m. there will be a dedication ceremony on the expanded detention facility. Invitations were sent to all legislators.

Katheryn Shields asked legislators for their advice on the changes regarding the circuit breaker law. She explained that this law affects senior citizens. The State of Missouri, out of state tax money, refunds seniors up to \$750.00 a year for money they pay in local property tax. Govenor Carnahan signed a revision to this law on July 8, 1998, which states that senior citizens owning their own homes making less than \$27,000.00 a year are eligible. Previously it was \$15,000.00. This is retroactive until the end of 1998 and if they apply for this benefit they can receive it back as far as 1995. Senior citizens who rent are eligible for up to 20% of their annual rent. Senior citizens in nursing homes are also eligible for a percentage of what they pay the nursing home. She suggested the county inform senior citizens of this availability.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, agreed that we should advise the seniors and a letter should be sent from the Assessment Department. He asked for an estimate of what such a mailing would cost.

Katheryn Shields said she will get an estimate and report back to the Legislature as soon as possible. She said the county may also want to consider an expanded program to help seniors complete the application since the forms are complicated.

Dixie M. Flynn, County Legislator, suggested using the public service television station on cable television. Also Health Midwest and St. Luke's have senior programs so the County might explore getting information to these entities regarding this change in the law.

Candidates being considered as nominees for the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority were interviewed. The candidates in attendance were Carl Schweitzer, Nancy Baker, and Jon Plaas. Not present was Jean Summers.
