WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing has solicited bids for the furnishing of comprehensive medical, dental, and pharmaceutical services for use by the Department of Corrections; and,

WHEREAS, a total of thirteen notifications were distributed and two responses were received and evaluated as follows:

WHEREAS, an evaluation team made up of representatives from the Department of Corrections and Truman Medical Center evaluated the bids on the basis of electronic records and reporting capabilities, financial stability, corporate experience and background.

WHEREAS, following evaluation of the bids received, the Director of Finance and Purchasing recommends the award of a thirty-six month contract with two twelve-month options to extend for the furnishing of comprehensive medical, dental, and pharmaceutical services to Correctional Healthcare Companies of Greenwood Village, CO, at a cost to the County not to exceed \$2,202,891.00, for the reason that it submitted the lowest and best bid; and,

WHEREAS, this award is made on an as needed basis and does not obligate Jackson County to pay any amount, with the availability of funds for specific purchases remaining subject to annual appropriation; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that award be made as recommended by the Director of Finance and Purchasing, and that the Director be and hereby is authorized to execute for the County any documents necessary to the accomplishment of the award; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Finance and Purchasing is authorized to make all payments, including final payment on the contract, to the extent that sufficient funds have been appropriated to the using spending agency in the then current Jackson County budget.

RFP 77-12 Medical Proposal Evaluation

Proposals from two respondents were evaluated by two Corrections staffs, the Deputy Director and the Manager of Services and by one TMC Behavioral Health staff, the Director of Behavioral Health at JCDC and RCC. Evaluation criteria were considered separately from contract costs with the cost review occurring after all evaluations and discussions were complete. Respondents were evaluated according to the following criteria as detailed in RFP 77-12.

Pertinent evaluator comments related to ACH included:

- o Electronic medical records capability with no cost to the County.
- o Not as global as other company
- o Both respondents utilize the same pharmacy services. Pharmacy has occasional long backorders for common meds
- Client list/references did not include contact names, phone numbers or email addresses
- o Physician and Dentist hours were not included in the staffing plan
- o Discharge plan does not address community needs

Pertinent evaluator comments related to CHC included:

- Electronic medical records provided with an extra cost to the County, but would be customized for JCDC
- o Well prepared and audited financial statement; appears secure
- o Extensive experience; excellent background in the stated field
- Listed current and former clients/references, stating reasons why former clients were no longer with them. Solicited information from references was overall very positive.
- More complete plan for release including a reduced price pharmacy card and limited provision of medications. Appears in-depth with a definite plan at discharge very clear and concise.
- o An all inclusive plan for recruitment, retention... with good explanation.
- o Step by step detailed transition plan

Upon review of the annual contract provisions related to costs, the following are important to note:

- o Both proposals provide \$100,000 in costs for specific services and pharmaceuticals in the base annual contract cost
- o Both proposals have provisions for additional costs with a rising ADP
 - CHC 0.52 per inmate per day with an ADP of 880 or higher
 - ACH 1.14 per inmate per day with an ADP of 800 or higher and .31 per inmate per day for "non-county" inmates
- o CHC will charge \$15 per screening for each inmate that is admitted, receives a health screening, and is released the same day (prior to the ADP count for that day). In the current year, this count is 1,533 admissions and would cost \$22,995.
- o CHC provided costs for "optional" electronic medical records at \$50,715 per year and an additional \$43,350 per year if a performance bond is required.
- o ACH will provide electronic medical records at no cost to the County, but did not express any provisions related to the performance bond requirement.
- o CHC will maintain the same contract costs for the first 36 months of the contract.
- o ACH did not provide information on continuing contract costs, but currently requires the CPI or 3%, whichever is less.

Even with stipulations for "options" of electronic medical records and payment of a performance bond, and the cited intake costs for CHC, the option 2 costs are lower than costs proposed by ACH. Evaluations of these proposals indicate that option 2 provided by CHC is the lowest and best bid for continued medical services at the Jackson County Department of Corrections.

The base contract fee with CHC includes 23.35 FTE's with professional staffing for 24/7 coverage at JCDC and the RCC. This includes: medical and dental services, coordination with mental health services, medical policy and procedure, medical supplies, medical waste removal, office supplies, and specific pharmaceutical services. The pool covers laboratory services, x-ray services, specific pharmaceutical services, and off site medical care such as dialysis. Costs related to the pool and to the ADP can be highly variable, for example, the annual \$100,000 pool for 2012 was expended in July, with an additional cost of \$77,985 through the end of October 2012. Corrections is also responsible for the purchase of medical equipment such as AED's, wheelchairs, exam tables, etc. Extra costs are covered in a medical contingency fund in the Corrections annual budget. Corrections would not require electronic medical records or a performance bond for this contract. In the medical fund for 2013, Corrections has budgeted \$2,351.317 for the medical contract and \$97,207 in contingency funds to cover ADP and pool overages, and equipment needs.

Aggregate Cap with County Rebate

CHC will incur the first \$100,000 in costs associated with healthcare services defined under its Aggregate Cap (Cap 1). Such services under the annual Aggregate Cap include all pharmaceuticals for municipal inmates; HIV, Hepatitis, mental health, cancer, and court-ordered pharmaceuticals for county and municipal inmates; onsite and offsite laboratory services; onsite and offsite radiology services; and onsite and offsite dialysis. Any expenses incurred for such services in excess of \$100,000 per year will be the responsibility of the County. Should the costs associated with the provision of healthcare services listed above not exceed \$100,000 in the aggregate in any contract year, CHC shall reimburse the County at a rate of 100% of the difference between the actual cost to CHC for these services and the \$100,000 Aggregate Cap.

Flexible Staffing Matrix

CHC will provide the County with a comprehensive healthcare staffing program consisting of qualified medical and mental health professionals. The following staffing matrices provide detailed staffing plans for the options previously outlined. Please note that the exact days shown in the charts below are for illustrative purposes only and are flexible to meet the County's needs. We will work with the County to create an exact schedule which best maximizes the County's utilization of CHC's resources.

Comprehensive Medical, Dental, and Pharmaceutical Services

CHC will provide the County with a wide-ranging inmate healthcare program consisting of either 23.85 or 23.35 equivalent full-time employees as well as comprehensive onsite medical, dental, and pharmaceutical services. CHC will also provide the County with healthcare policies and procedures, 24 hours a day on-call services, medical and office supplies, medical waste disposal, comprehensive medical malpractice insurance, as well as corporate management and oversight.

Pharmacy

Our proposal includes a comprehensive pharmacy program and management solution. This program includes medication prescribing, filling, dispensing, administration, accurate recordkeeping, reporting/invoicing, and quality assurance. CHC will be responsible for all the pharmaceutical costs incurred for County inmates, with the exception of certain medications that are included in the cap.

Optional Services

Should the County desire to implement Vizion, CHC's electronic medical record (EMR) system, CHC would charge \$5.25 per inmate per month. The approximate annual cost for these services based on an average population of 805 inmates would be approximately \$50,715.

If the County elects to implement a 100% performance bond requirement, the annual price would increase by \$43,350.

Population Adjustments

This proposal is based on a base average daily population (ADP) of 805 total adult inmates. If, in any calendar month, the County ADP exceeds 880 inmates, the County will pay CHC a per diem of \$0.52 per inmate to be reconciled quarterly. If, in any calendar month, the ADP falls below 720 inmates, CHC will credit the County a per diem of \$0.52 per inmate to be reconciled quarterly.

This per diem is intended to cover additional costs in those instances where short-term changes in the inmate population result in higher utilizations of routine supplies and services. However, the per diem is not intended to provide for any additional fixed costs, such as new staffing positions, which might prove necessary if the inmate population grows significantly and if the population increase is sustained. In such cases, CHC reserves the right to negotiate for a contract price increase in order to maintain the same high quality of care for the increased inmate population. If the County experiences a sustained decrease in inmate population, CHC is open to discussing changes in staffing levels to better reflect the normalized inmate population.

Other Staffing Costs

Should CHC staff provide a receiving screening for inmates that are released or transferred from the facility on the same day, and are therefore not included in the ADP, CHC will charge a \$15 screening fee. Additionally, should CHC staff members be involved in court-related testimony associated with healthcare that we provide, CHC reserves the right to bill for those hours.
