AN ORDINANCE repealing section 540., <u>Jackson County Code</u>,1984, relating to the property tax levy and enacting, in lieu thereof, one new section relating to the same subject.

ORDINANCE #4228, August 23, 2010

WHEREAS, a recent amendment to section 137.055, RSMo, has changed the date by which the County is required to set its annual permanent property tax levy; and,

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the applicable County Code provision be amended to conform with state law; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is in the best interests of the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

Section A. <u>Enacting Clause</u>. Sections 540., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, is hereby repealed, and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 540., to read as follows:

540. Levy, Permanent.

The County Legislature shall adopt and fix a permanent county property tax levy not later than [September twentieth] October 1 of each year.

540.1 Public Hearing Required Before Adoption.

Prior to adopting and fixing the permanent tax levy, the County Legislature shall hold a public hearing on the proposed permanent levy in accordance with the provisions of section 137.055, RSMo.
