PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into on this AGREEMENT, made and entered into on this AGREEMENT, day of 2010, by and between JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, hereinafter called "the County," and RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE, 3801 Southwest Trafficway, Kansas City, MO 64111, hereinafter called "RDI."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has a need for grant writing services for the Housing Resources Commission; and,

WHEREAS, RDI is able to perform such grant writing services and has agreed to do so in accordance with the terms set forth in this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, County and RDI respectively agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Professional Services</u>. RDI shall provide grant writing services for the Housing Resources Commission, as is more fully set forth in the RDI's proposal, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. Independent Contractor. RDI shall work as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the County. RDI shall be subject to the direction of the County only as to the result to be accomplished and not as to the means and methods for accomplishing the result. RDI shall report all earnings received hereunder as gross income, and be responsible for its own Federal, State, and City withholding taxes and all other taxes, and operate its business independent of the business of the County, except as required by this Agreement.

- 3. <u>Terms for Payment</u>. The County shall pay RDI a total amount not to exceed \$3,750.00 for all work completed under this Agreement. RDI shall be entitled to bill the County for all hours worked, at a rate of \$80.00 per hour, and the County shall pay said billings promptly upon receipt.
- 4. <u>Expenses</u>. The County shall reimburse RDI for its reasonable expenses, provided the total amount payable under this contract shall not exceed \$3,750.00.
- 5. <u>Duration and Termination</u>. This Agreement shall be effective upon execution and shall continue through December 31, 2010, unless sooner terminated. RDI or the County may terminate this Agreement for any reason by giving three (3) days written notice to the other party. Termination of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of the rights or obligations which County or RDI may be entitled to receive or be obligated to perform under this Agreement for services prior to the date of termination, but payment pursuant to paragraph 3 of this Agreement shall terminate as of the date of said notice, and shall be prorated through that date. Should this Agreement terminate, all County written materials of any kind must be delivered and returned by the RDI to the County within ten (10) days after the termination of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Assignment</u>. RDI agrees, in addition to all other provisions herein, that RDI shall not assign any portion or the whole of this contract without the prior written consent of the County.
- 7. <u>Time of the Essence</u>. Timely performance of all duties provided herein is of the essence of this Agreement.
- 8. Remedies for Breach. RDI agrees to faithfully observe and perform all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and RDI's failure to do so shall represent and

constitute a breach of this Agreement. In such event, RDI consents and agrees as follows:

- (1) The County may without prior notice to RDI immediately terminate this Agreement; and,
- (2) The County shall be entitled to seek any available legal remedy and to collect from RDI all costs incurred by the County as a result of said breach including reasonable attorney's fees, costs, and expenses.
- 9. <u>Severability.</u> If any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid, or incapable of being enforced, by reasons of any rule of law or public policy, all other conditions and provisions of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.
- 10. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. RDI warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall in any manner whatsoever be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this contract.
- 11. <u>Incorporation.</u> This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.



We do not foresee any circumstances where we will need to contract out any of the work, therefore we do not anticipate the need to explore contracting any services from Minority-Owned/Women-Owned Business Enterprises.

- o Provide progress reports with billing invoices identifying in detail the services provided during the billing period.
