Fred Arbanas moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 12/1/2003. Seconded by Bob Spence.

4 HEARINGS

Public Hearing regarding Ordinance #3442, setting the 2004 Jackson County, Missouri tentative tax levy and Ordinance #3441, to adopt the annual budget and set forth appropriations for the various spending agencies and the principal subdivisions thereof, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2004.

Dennis Waits opened the public hearing.

Cecil Vaughn, former County Legislator, an unpaid lobbyist and concerned citizen spoke in favor of the improved package for the Sheriff's Department to hire additional dispatchers.

Joe Pace, Commissioner of the Inter City Fire Department and a volunteer firefighter for 27 years, emphasized the need for additional dispatchers in the Jackson County Sheriff's Department so that emergency calls for the Blue Summit area could be quickly dispatched to the Inter City Fire Department. He said the boundaries for the fire district are 9th Street on the North, Blue Ridge on the East, 23rd on the South and 435 on the West.

Sheriff Deputy Steve Palmer of the Community Resource Unit, addressed the Legislature regarding the radios used by the Sheriff's Department. He said communication is terrible throughout Jackson County and that the Midland radios, which they use, are antiquated. He added that the Fraternal Order of Police does not represent more than 50% of the Sheriff's Department.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, said the County Legislature cannot do anything regarding the personnel matter in the Sheriff's Department. The Legislature encourages resolution between the Sheriff's Department and the Fraternal Order of Police.

Deputy Palmer said the main problem is binding arbitration. He said the majority of the department does not want to unionize and it is against the law to force the issue.

Henry C. Rizzo, County Legislator, reiterated that the Legislature is not holding up this process. However, he feels that the percentage of members who want to unionize would have a voice also.

Deputy Palmer said he understands the philosophy of unions, but he feels it is not appropriate in police work.

Dennis Waits, Chairman, said when dealing with the budget, the Sheriff needs to be present to discuss his stand regarding equipment or personnel for his Department.

Gary Kilgore, Sergeant and Records Unit Supervisor in the Sheriff's Department, said a paramount issue is the under staffing in his department which directly impacts the compliance of the Defender Registration Program. He said in Missouri, Jackson County has the highest number of offenders and the least amount of staff. He encouraged the Legislature to support the improved package of the Sheriff's Department which included 2 deputies and 2 clerks for Staff Services.

Henry C. Rizzo asked if two additional deputies are hired how will the Legislature know they will be assigned to Staff Services.

Sergeant Kilgore said two deputies are earmarked for his area.

Casy Vest, Chief of the Inter City Fire Department and also a volunteer fireman reiterated the need for better communication equipment and said he was speaking on behalf of the community in the Blue Summit area.

The public hearing regarding the 2004 Jackson County, Missouri tentative tax levy and the 2004 budget was closed.
