5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, gave a brief overview of some of the site improvements planned for the downtown Courthouse. These improvements involve the parking lot, the grounds, building access and security. Major goals will be to improve security at the south entrance and improve the employee parking lot by adding a perimeter fence and repaving the surface. A loading dock area will be built for deliveries. There will be authorized card access for the parking lot and south entrance for better security. An outdoor plaza is also being created away from the entrances for those who smoke.

Rhonda L. Shoemaker, County Legislator, asked if the width of the parking spaces would change. Katheryn Shields said they would stay about the same.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, questioned where the prisoners would enter the Courthouse. Katheryn said Corrections will have a card for the parking lot and go in through the south entrance from the garage.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, asked Bruce Palmer, Director of Facilities Management, to provide an overview of the arena so they have some sense of a time table of the street closings and where they will actually occur. Mr. Palmer said he will get the information and give it to the Legislature.

Robert A. Stringfield, County Legislator, said that Kelly Markham-Stegall, County Auditor, is doing a security audit and wondered if some of the recommendations she might have can work with some of the recommendations Katheryn Shields is talking about. Kelly Markham-Stegall said her office has been working on the audit off and on since 2003 and has started full force on it again at the beginning of this year.

Robert A. Stringfield asked how long it would be until the Auditors office can share some of the information with the administration. Kelly Markham-Stegall said they are scheduled to have the audit completed by May 2005

Robert A. Stringfield said that he is under the impression that we are in violation of making sure each district has a commissioner in the district according to the Charter regarding the Office of Human Relations and Citizen Complaints. He was told three weeks ago that they were filled but now there are two districts still not filled. There is an Executive Order today so how are we going to fill the one remaining district if you have three districts that are filled with two.

Katheryn said there is only one opening and that is in the third district. She hopes to have that filled by next week. There was an error where someone identified in the fourth district was actually in the first district. That individual has been informed they were incorrectly appointed and is no longer a member of OHRCC.

Robert Stringfield said he has letters sent to a couple of people saying that Katheryn would consider them for the third district. They have been interviewed and they have been interested in this position for quite a long time. He would appreciate Katheryn's consideration of these people.

Dan Tarwater, Chairman, announced that a report will be given next week by Ken Evans, Communications/E-Government Coordinator, regarding downtown parking.

J. D. Williamson, Presiding Judge, commented on the parking plan presented to the legislature. He said it is a wonderful enhancement to the security. He has been working with the County Executive and is glad to see this work going on.

Henry C. Rizzo, County Legislator, wanted to know how far away the nearest deputy is when they are in court. Judge Williamson said that there are at least two jail guards present if it is a criminal case with a prisoner in custody. They are close to the defendant and are in total control. If they are not in custody, there are panic buttons that will immediately notify the Sheriff's Office when pushed.
